Franklin Tomorrow's Get Fit Franklin helps City of Franklin earn **Healthier Tennessee** status. In early 2015, **Franklin Mayor Ken Moore** asked Franklin Tomorrow to further its partnership with the City and use its existing Get Fit Franklin program – founded in 2011 -- to represent **the City with the Governor's Foundation** for a Healthier Tennessee in an effort to achieve pilot status. To be designated, the communities – **Tullahoma, Hickman County, and Franklin** – established wellness councils and developed sustainable community-wide events and activities that support physical activity, healthy eating and tobacco abstinence.

The existing Get Fit Franklin committee evolved into a Wellness Council, which meets regularly and in partnership with other governmental, health, and interested organizations and individuals. Financial support was provided by **Vanderbilt Health, BlueCross BlueShield of Tennessee, and Williamson Medical Center** for a variety of activities related to healthy eating, reducing tobacco use, and increased physical activity. Special thanks to the Parks Programming Division, Paige Cruse, Suzanne Carter, Amy Gillard and Dylan Wright for helping with the Get Fit Franklin activities.

Next week, **TDOT (Tennessee Department of Transportation) and Keep Williamson Beautiful** are partnering with the **Williamson County Sheriff's Office** to clean litter along Mack Hatcher Parkway. All equipment, water, and lunch will be provided. The clean-up is from 8am-5pm, Wednesday, June 8. Volunteers will meet in the Target parking lot at 3064 Columbia Avenue. Open enrollment for benefit changes will be **May 16th to June 14th** with changes being effective July 1st. **All open enrollment changes will be done online using Kronos Employee Self-Service**. There will no longer be paper enrollment or change forms with this process. Please note that the City has decided to have only one open enrollment per year; therefore, eliminating the December open enrollment. You will still be able to make benefit changes if you have a qualifying event and the changes must be made within 31 days of that event. If you do not wish to make any changes to your current medical benefits, then no action is needed.
