SUBJECT: Household Survey - 2012

Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) with information and solicit feedback regarding the Household Survey.

Background

The Franklin Household Survey has been used in the past to gauge public perception of the community and of City services. Franklin conducted its first Household Survey in 1987 to solicit public opinion about quality of life issues facing the community. Since then a survey has been conducted in 1996, 2000 and 2006. The results of the survey have served as a reliable source of information for measuring its performance, for identifying the needs of the community, and as a mechanism for guiding the BOMA and the FMPC in their planning and growth management decision making efforts.

Over the years, the survey has been modified, and expanded, to address certain issues that have moved to the forefront of the City's agenda. Questions on the survey have addressed City services. City and neighborhood conditions, growth and development, housing costs, transportation, and household demographics, subdivision developments, design preferences, as well as status and direction of the City.

The 1996 Household Survey was mailed to 22,250 households and 6,572 surveys were returned for a return rate of approximately 30 percent. The 2006 Household Survey included 120 questions covering Quality of Life Citizen Characteristics, City Services, Water Quality, Neighborhoods, Pace and Type of Growth, City Direction and Status, Community Facilities, Housing, Commercial and Residential Development, Traffic, Commuting Patterns, Curbside Recycling. Within the above categories, there were specific questions related to neighborhood conditions, design preferences, park facilities and questions related to how residents prefer to receive information from the City.

The budget for the Household Survey in 2006 was \$34,683, which did not include temporary part-time people to compile the results. Since 2006, postage rates have increased, and it is likely that the cost of temporary employees will also be higher. Some of this cost could possibly be offset by greater use of social media. Also, some of the issues contained in the 2006 Household Survey were covered by Franklin Tomorrow in their vision process. While not an individual mailing, Franklin Tomorrow did extensive outreach regarding quality of life issues in Franklin. The efforts of Franklin Tomorrow might allow a less expansive survey instrument in certain categories.

Therefore, staff would estimate a 2012 Household Survey of the same magnitude as 2006 would cost between \$50,000 and \$65,000 and take approximately seven months to complete.

Another option for measuring household satisfaction is the National Citizens Survey offered by International City/County Management Association (ICMA) and the National Research Center.

The National Citizen Survey could provide the City of Franklin with the opportunity for a cost effective, tested and flexible survey service allowing the City of Franklin to gain information regarding citizen's opinions for program planning, budgeting, goal setting and performance measurement. Limited to five pages, the Citizen Survey, much like our previous Household Surveys, has questions concerning quality of life, local policies, demographic data, quality of local government services and use of services. The survey service includes all mailing and data management in addition to detailed analysis and comparison to other communities as well as our own surveys in the past. Mailings are sent to, 1,200 randomly selected households, resulting in a 95 percent confidence interval and a margin of error of no more than 5 percentage points. Three reports will be provided that include an executive summary, statistical analysis of survey results and comparison to national norms. An added benefit of the national survey would be the opportunity to benchmark the City of Franklin's results with other communities across the country that have used the same or similar survey.

A fee of approximately \$15,000 covers the base and vital add on services which includes three specially tailored policy questions, multiple mailings to 1,200 randomly selected households, data cleaning and input, statistical analysis of survey results, custom norms based on city population, comparison to prior survey results, as well as geographic crosstabs and demographic crosstabs reports. In addition to the three custom questions, the City can choose to add an open-ended question, supplement with a phone survey or expand the number of survey recipients. All of these could be options added for less than \$30,000.

Financial Impact

It is estimated a staff administered Household Survey would cost between \$50,000 and \$65,000. The National Citizens Survey would cost between \$10,300 and \$30,000 depending upon added services.
