20. Please read the following and upon signature of this application, you do understand and agree to comply if you are granted a permit.

- (a) You will not sell beer or similar beverages except at the place or places for which the beer board has issued your permit.
- (b) You will not sell beer or any like beverage except in accordance with the terms of said permit.
- (c) If this application is made for permit to sell and not for consumption on the premises, you will not sell for consumption on the premises and not allow consumption on the premises.
- (d) You will rigidly enforce the law against sales to minors.
- (e) You will prohibit gambling at your establishment and understand that the conduct of such activities on the premises will result in revocation of your permit.
- (f) You will secure a certificate or statement from the health department or health officer that the premises covered by the application meet the requirements of the ordinances of the City of Franklin and the laws of the State of Tennessee.
- (g) You will not attempt to transfer this permit to anyone else.
- (h) You will display this permit in a prominent place in your establishment.
- (i) You will not sell or distribute beer between the hours of 3:00 AM and 6:00 AM (8:00 AM for on premises consumption) during the week and between the hours of 3:00 AM Sunday and 12:00 Noon Sunday (10:00 AM for on premises consumption).
- (j) You will prohibit the congregation at your establishment of those who reasonably appear to be intoxicated, lawless, rowdy, or prostitutes.
- (k) You will not allow any liquor with alcoholic content of greater than five percent (5%) to be consumed on the premises.
- (l) You will not allow any sale or delivery of beer for consumption on the premises outside of the building, it being the intention to prohibit the sale of beer by what is commonly known as "curb service" or "curb sales" of beer.
- (m) You will comply with all requirements of section 2-201 through 2-229 of the municipal code of the City of Franklin.

A non-refundable \$250 fee must accompany this application and the application shall be submitted at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Beer Board meeting at which it is to be considered. If the application is approved you are required to provide documentation of sales tax registration to the city within ten days of approval. Any applicant making false statement in this application shall forfeit his permit and shall not be eligible to receive any permit for a period of ten years.

A privilege tax of \$100 is imposed on the business of selling, distributing, storing or manufacturing beer in this state effective January 1, 1994 and each successive January 1. Any holder of a beer permit issued after January 1, 1994 shall pay a pro rata portion of this annual tax when the permit is issued.

I hereby make application to the City of Franklin Beer Board for a beer permit.

The signing of this application acknowledges that I am aware of the laws prohibiting the sale of beer to minors.

I hereby certify that no person having at least a 5% ownership interest, nor any person to be employed in the distribution or sale of beer in my establishment has been convicted of any violation of the beer or alcoholic beverage laws or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past 10 years.

I am also aware that I shall not be issued a permit or my permit shall be revoked if my business location causes traffic congestion or interferes with schools, churches, or other public places of public gathering, or otherwise interferes with public health, safety and morals.

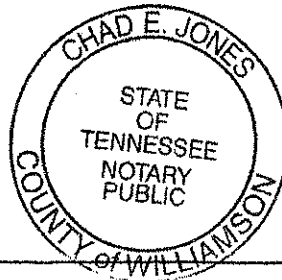



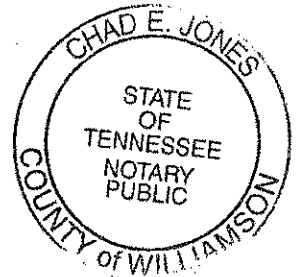

Safe Alcohol Sales Training

for

the Service Staff at Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company

Basic Concepts of Responsible Beverage Service

It is the responsibility of Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company and its employees to execute sales of our alcoholic products in a manner both in accordance with Tennessee state law and that is safe for the end consumer. Tennessee Code §57-4-203 prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age. The sale of alcoholic beverages to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age constitutes a Class A misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment for not more than eleven (11) months twenty-nine (29) days and/or a fine not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) as outlined in §40-53-111 of the Tennessee Code. Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company and the employee who executes an illegal sale are equally liable. Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company strictly prohibits the sale of our alcoholic products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.

Tennessee Code §57-4-203 also prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages to visibly intoxicated persons. Intoxicated persons are a danger to themselves and others. The sale of alcoholic beverages to visibly intoxicated persons is a Class A misdemeanor and is strictly prohibited at Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company.

Serving Beer to Customers

All bar service employees at Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company are to take the following steps when serving our beer to customers in our taproom:

1. Welcome the customer
2. Politely ask for the customer's driver's license (passports will be accepted in lieu of a driver's license)
3. Identify the customer's age and check the expiration date on the driver's license. If the customer is twenty-one (21) years of age or older, continue on to #4. If the customer is not yet at least twenty-one (21) years of age, the server may offer the customer water then greet the next customer.
4. Compare the picture on the license to the customer. Check eye color and height first. Then compare facial structure and weight.
5. Then examine the driver's license itself. Any of the following may indicate that a driver's license has been tampered with:
 - a. Raised edges around the photo could indicate that a new photo has been placed over the original
 - b. Fuzzy numbers and text
 - c. Misspelled words
 - d. Red eye in the photo
 - e. Holograms flake off when scratched
 - f. Bubbles under the lamination
6. Examine the customer. Any of the following may indicate that the customer is underage:

- a. Slight physical build in the shoulders, chest, hips, arms, and/or thighs
 - b. Lack of facial hair
 - c. Thin and unweathered hands
 - d. Physical signs of nervous tension
 - e. High pitched or cracking voice
 - f. Excessive talking
 - g. Inappropriate clothing for simulated age
 - h. Incorrect responses to questions
7. If customer has been determined to be at least twenty-one (21) years of age, then examine for signs of intoxication. Any of the following are indicators that the customer may be intoxicated:
- a. Bloodshot or glassy eyes
 - b. Flushed complexion
 - c. Disheveled hair or clothing
 - d. Staggering when walking
 - e. Unsteady on feet
 - f. Odor of alcohol about their breath
 - g. Uncoordinated actions or movements
 - h. Incoherent, garbled, or slurred speech
 - i. Boisterous, loud, or profane language
8. If the customer is determined to be at least twenty-one (21) years of age AND sober the sale of beer is approved.

Tending to Underage Customers

In the event that an underage customer attempts to misrepresent himself or herself with false identification, the "fake ID" will be held by the service staff and the police will be called.

Tending to Intoxicated Customers

In the event that an intoxicated customer enters the taproom or a customer becomes intoxicated while visiting the taproom, the service staff will offer to call the customer a cab and then the customer will be asked to leave. If the customer refuses to leave the police will be called.

Tending to Customers Ordering Multiple Beers At One Time

Customers may order multiple beers at one time. However, all customers that consume beer must present the service staff with a valid driver's license before the sale is executed.

Beer is Sold to an Underage Customer

Turtle Anarchy Brewing Company adopts a zero tolerance policy regarding the sale of beer to underage customers. In the event that beer is sold to an underage person, the police will be called.

Responsible Beverage Service is Necessary

We must accept responsibility for the safe enjoyment of our products on our premises. If there is any doubt whether a customer is of legal drinking age or sober the sale of beer to that customer is strictly prohibited. The service staff is encouraged to support one another when attempting to deal with an unreasonable or irrational customer.

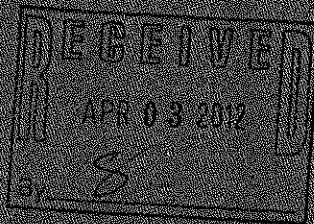
