**SUBJECT:** Wounded Warriors Event Applications

### **Purpose**

The purpose of this memorandum is to outline recommendations for approval of the Wounded Warriors Soldier Ride and 8K Event applications.

### **Background**

"Soldier Ride" is a Wounded Warrior Project event that provides adaptive cycling opportunities to help wounded warriors restore their physical and emotional well-being. This year, the event is adding an 8K run for community supporters. Only soldiers will participate in the Soldier Ride. The event is scheduled for November 3<sup>rd</sup> and will begin and end at Battleground Academy on Ernest Rice Lane. This year, the ride consists of only the 24-mile route, which comes through Downtown. The organization estimates 50 participants in the Soldier Ride and 1,000 participants in the 8K. One hundred percent (100%) of the proceeds benefit the Wounded Warrior Project programs and initiatives.

### Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the event application with the following recommendations:

- Applicant will provide a \$1,000 refundable damage deposit to City prior to event.
- Applicant will provide a Good Neighbor letter which will be distributed to affected neighborhoods.

### • Risk Management:

o Applicant will provide certificate of insurance naming the City as additional insured.

### • Police Department:

- o Applicant will hire a total of eight Franklin Police Officers to provide rolling street closures and traffic control. Department will also provide on-shift officers to assist.
- Applicant will work with Williamson County Sheriff's Office for traffic control in areas outside of the City limits of Franklin.
- o Coordinators will meet with staff prior to the event to go over final logistics.

### • Building & Neighborhood Services:

o Special Event Electrical Permit may be required.

### • Solid Waste Department:

O Department will contact Battleground Academy to determine if extra containers or pick-ups will be required.

### • Fire Department:

o EMS will also follow both routes in vehicle or bike.







Dorie - Tara Swafford gave me your contact information. I am the community liaison for the Wounded Warrior Project. The WWP's mission is to honor and empower our wounded warriors. I have been a part of their Soldier Ride program for over 6 years and have seen first hand the huge impact the program has made in the lives of these brave men and women who have sacrificed so much while protecting our freedom.

The purpose of this e-mail is to discuss a very special event coming to Franklin on Nov 3 and its possible impact on the Deerfield community.

The Soldier Ride (held in Memory of Master Sergeant Tre Ponder - Franklin native - BGA grad) is a WWP program that is held in many cities (including New York & Washington, DC) and involves dozens of wounded warriors on adaptive bicycles. The event brings together patriotic folks who want to simply say thanks to these heroes while providing a means for our wounded to start their healing process of returning to the civilian world. Last year's ride was lead by our own Lance Corporal Ben Maenza - Brentwood Marine) who lost both legs to an IED. U-Haul executives and Congressman Marsha Blackburn presented Ben with his own personal bike to further continue his rehabilitation.



This will be the second year we will start from Battle Ground Academy and we look forward to returning again.







Dorie - Tara Swafford gave me your contact information. I am the community liaison for the Wounded Warrior Project. The WWP's mission is to honor and empower our wounded warriors. I have been a part of their Soldier Ride program for over 6 years and have seen first hand the huge impact the program has made in the lives of these brave men and women who have sacrificed so much while protecting our freedom.

The purpose of this e-mail is to discuss a very special event coming to Franklin on Nov 3 and its possible impact on the Deerfield community.

The Soldier Ride (held in Memory of Master Sergeant Tre Ponder - Franklin native - BGA grad) is a WWP program that is held in many cities (including New York & Washington, DC) and involves dozens of wounded warriors on adaptive bicycles. The event brings together patriotic folks who want to simply say thanks to these heroes while providing a means for our wounded to start their healing process of returning to the civilian world. Last year's ride was lead by our own Lance Corporal Ben Maenza - Brentwood Marine) who lost both legs to an IED. U-Haul executives and Congressman Marsha Blackburn presented Ben with his own personal bike to further continue his rehabilitation.
