 - ▲ Howard Johnston, Fifth Avenue North property, asked for continued support for this ordinance. He can't put his property back like it was, so this gives him options.

Alderman Martin moved to approve Ordinance 2012-35 on Second of Three Readings. Seconded by Alderman Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

[Second of Three Readings] Alderman Ann Petersen, FMPC Board Representative With no one coming forward to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing Closed

Alderman Petersen moved to Approve Ordinance 2012-37 on Second of Three Readings. Seconded by Alderman Bransford. Motion carried unanimously.

- 15. <u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> Consideration of ORDINANCE 2012-39, An Ordinance to Rezone ±0.96 Acres from Low Residential District (R-1) To High Residential District (R-3) for the Property Located at 711 Hillsboro Road (6/28/12 FMPC 6-1 Recommendation to Disapprove; 7/24/12 BOMA 5-2) [Second of Three Readings] Alderman Ann Petersen, FMPC Board Representative
 - * Alderman Martin was recused and left the meeting

Public Hearing

▲ Cornelia Holland, 801 Hillsboro Road, said she opposed the rezoning of 711 Hillsboro Road from R-1 to R-3 because of the potential impact on the Hillsboro Road neighborhood from

Frazier Drive to Mack Hatcher Parkway. Sullivan Engineering once said this area presented one of the most difficult challenges in addressing stormwater drainage. The lot at 711 is one of the lowest lots with stormwater drainage at the north and western sides of the lot. An underground spring exists on 707 Hillsboro Road. City engineers have stated the proposed Streetscape stormwater system will not be sufficient to handle the water pushed from the spring during high levels of the Harpeth. Mr. Hardcastle indicated in a letter to the neighbors he would restrict the deed for the proposed lot at 790 to "no smaller than 2,200 sq. ft., no larger than 4,000 sq.ft..." question the impact additional pavement and a house as large as 4,000 sq. ft. might have on drainage. R-3 is defined as allowing three houses per acre. Ms. Holland used Glen Echo Road in Green Hills as an example of what might happen. She listed reasons why this area should be maintained and protected as part of Franklin's heritage. (Ms. Holland submitted her entire statement for the record and it is filed with the minutes)

- ▲ Mort Stein, 1627 Kinnard Drive, indicated he is in favor of the rezoning. Staff had said this should be studied. The Hardcastle property is the only one than can be built on. He quoted Alderman McLendon's comment from last meeting that the Board should not make a decision based on the worst possible scenario that could happen. Mr. Stein added that several houses on the lot would not be feasible. Rezoning makes sense and should be approved.
- ▲ Loy Hardcastle, property owner, said he is trying to divide a lot and put one house on one lot. It is the only lot like it to Del Rio Pike. It can't be zoned R-1 because the lot is 0.96 just shy of one acre. He was unhappy a simple request on the part of a landowner had come to this. He said he appreciated being able to state his case.

With no one else coming forward to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing Closed

Alderman Blanton moved to approve Ordinance 2012-39 for a zoning change to allow the landowner to fulfill his request. Seconded by Alderman Burger.

Discussion:

- Alderman Blanton said the intent is obvious and it is frustrating that the 0.96 cannot be rounded up to 1 acre. She added that she was not happy going to the R-3 zoning; however, she didn't think that the worst case scenario would happen with everyone wanting to rezone.
- Alderman McLendon recounted what he said last meeting that he doesn't oppose construction of a home on a vacant lot as it can be done in a way that looks like it has been there forever. He hoped the applicant would be respectful of the neighborhood if the ordinance passes. The homes there are long established. The changes to Hillsboro Road will be significant. Curbs and gutters will be much closer to those homes and they will sell and leave when that happens. Concerned if R-3 is granted, when the project is done economic conditions could lead to investor driven applications for rezoning. He wished it could be R-2 as well. R-1 used to be the placeholder and we now know why that doesn't work. Create a zoning classification that works there. Can't support because of creating R-3 zoning up and down Hillsboro Road.
- ▲ Alderman Petersen said her concern was opening it up and making a talking point for anyone else who wants the same zoning.
- ▲ Alderman Bransford agreed with Alderman Petersen. She did say she was not concerned the

- house would be inappropriate. However, she could not support the Ordinance
- Alderman Barnhill said he had an issue with spot zoning this and thought a deed restriction had been offered. He said Hillsboro Road would not come to fruition for 10 years and at that time he expects it will be totally different. He didn't see a solution to take the zoning to R-2 and is not comfortable with R-3. Could not support.
- Alderman McLendon disagreed that Hillsboro Road would take 10 years and would be more like 10-15 months. He doesn't like the confines of R1, R2, and R3 and asked Eric Stuckey to fast-track some kind of overlay district or something that can accommodate good, positive change. Some of those homes will not survive; although, when Hillsboro Road is done there will still be beautiful homes that sit very close to the road.
- ▲ Alderman Barnhill asked if this should be deferred to look at an overlay or just not pass it.
- ▲ Alderman McLendon said he didn't want the applicant to have to go back to the Planning Commission and start over. Create something narrow and limited that could be applicable again; using this as a test case.

Alderman McLendon moved to defer Ordinance 2012-39 for further action to the first regular BOMA meeting in January 2013. Seconded by Alderman Burger. Motion to defer carried unanimously (7-0) with Alderman Martin recused.

- * Alderman Martin rejoined the meeting.

Alderman Petersen related that she voted against this at the FMPC meeting and questions if all hotels should be suite hotels. There are some hotels in Franklin that do not have some of the amenities listed. She doesn't want to make everything full service with these requirements.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2012-38 on First of Three Readings carried 6-2 with Aldermen Petersen and Skinner voting against.

Alderman Barnhill moved to approve Resolution 2012-45. Seconded by Alderman Petersen. Motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Petersen said she had questions, the same questions she asked before. She understands that Harpeth Valley has lower rates. They are a source for the City. Mallory Valley also has lower rates than Franklin. Why?

Mark Hilty explained that municipal utilities must recover costs and it is all based on operations. There can be a very wide range and it is based on what the utility does.

Eric Stuckey added that there are differences in the age of the systems; others also get water from Harpeth Valley. The size and distance of the pipes and maintenance can make a difference. Each one has its own unique mix of components. Not all are created equal. The City is significantly lower than some others in the region.

Alderman Petersen said that question would come up because the City is getting ready to raise rates. Should the City get its water from another source rather than producing water?

Mr. Stuckey said the study shows the water the City produces is cheaper than buying from a source. Staff continues to look at these issues.
