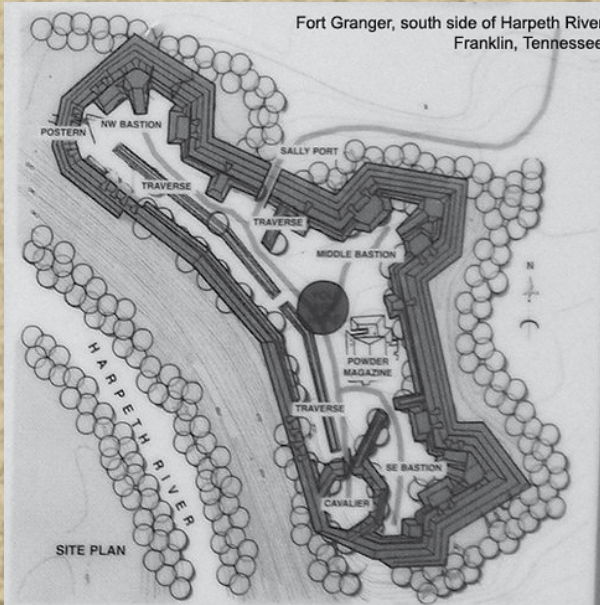

This is a Self Guided Cell Phone Audio Tour of Historic Franklin Park Sites impacted by the Battle of Franklin during the Civil War.

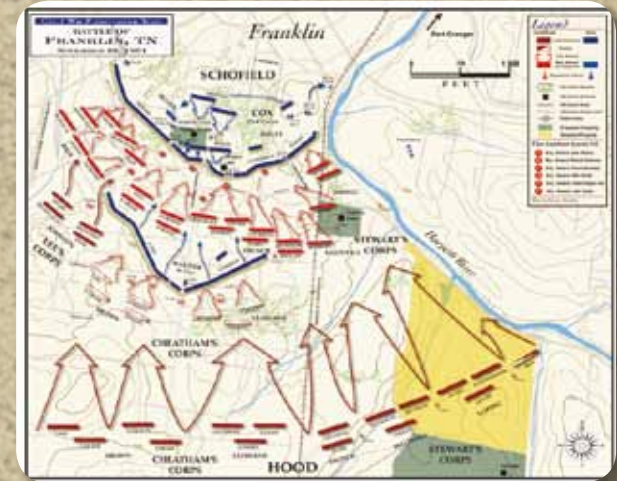
