**A RESOLUTION ENDORSING TENNESSEE MUNICIPAL
LEAGUE'S TENNESSEE DRUG CARD PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Drug Card Program is an initiative of the Tennessee Municipal League to provide citizens of Tennessee with discounts on prescription drugs and other medical services; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Drug Card is free of charge to both the City of Franklin and Franklin residents that offers an average discount on medications of over 30 percent; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Drug Card requires no enrollment forms, no age, income or other eligibility restrictions, no annual or lifetime benefit limits, and covers pre-existing conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Drug Card program is a confidential discount drug program for both insured and uninsured residents; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Drug Card is accepted at over 56,000 pharmacies and can be used on brand and generic medications as well as other medical benefits and services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin desires to extend these benefits to its citizens and employees,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, that the City of Franklin hereby endorses the Tennessee Municipal League's Tennessee Drug Card program and authorizes actions by the City to facilitate distribution of cards to Franklin citizens and employees.

Subject: Tennessee Municipal League's Tennessee Drug Card Program.

Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide information to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) about the Tennessee Municipal League's (TML) Tennessee Drug Card Program and ask for approval to publicly endorse the program for Franklin residents.

Background

The Tennessee Drug Card Program is an initiative of the Tennessee Municipal League to provide the citizens of Tennessee with discounts on prescription drugs. This program is completely confidential and can be used by insured or uninsured residents. There are no restrictions as to which residents can utilize the card. The prescription card is pre-activated and is accepted at over 56,000 pharmacies. It can be used on brand and generic medications, as well as some other medical benefits including diabetic supplies, hearing aids, prescription eye glasses, teeth whitening, and Lasik eye surgery. In order to bring the program to Franklin, the city would send a high resolution City of Franklin logo to the program contact. The program contact would then create cards for the city and the city would place them at certain distribution points around the community (City Hall, participating Pharmacies, etc.).

Financial Impact

The Tennessee Drug Card Program is free to both the city and Franklin residents. There are no premiums or deductibles. Printable cards are available free of charge on the website, www.tennesseedruggcard.com.

Options

The Board may choose to endorse and decide not to endorse the Tennessee Drug Card Program.

Recommendations

Approval to advertise and endorsement of the TML Tennessee Drug Card Program for Franklin residents is recommended.

- ★ **Confidential.** No personal information is required to get a card. No personal information is collected on processed prescriptions.

The city of _____ joined with the Tennessee Drug Card Partnership to provide access to a discount prescription drug card program at no cost to area residents of [Name of City] and [Name of County].

The partnership was recently launched to make prescription drugs more affordable to the uninsured. Statewide, there are more than 867,000 Tennesseans who do not have insurance. In [Name of County] county, [total of people] or [percentage] percent do not have access to medical insurance.

Plus, the program can be used by people who have health insurance coverage with no prescription benefits, which is common in many health savings accounts and high deductible plans. And people who have prescription coverage can use this program for non-covered drugs. The Tennessee Drug Card provides savings of up to 75% on prescription medications and at no cost to the user. For the year 2011, the average savings was 32% off retail pricing for brand and generic drug prescriptions.

The card is accepted at more than 56,000 national and regional pharmacies around the country. About 900 pharmacies in Tennessee participate, including CVS, Walgreens, Target, Publix and Kroger. A complete list of the participating pharmacies can be found at www.tennesseedrugcard.com/pharmacy.php.

What is it?

As a participant in the Tennessee Drug Card Program, you are afforded the opportunity to offer your residents prescription drug discounts. This card is *FREE* and provides savings of up to 75% on prescription drugs at more than 56,000 pharmacies across the country including CVS/pharmacy, Fred's, Kmart, Harris Teeter, Ingles, Target, Walmart, BI-LO Pharmacy, Walgreens, and many more. The discount drug program was originally developed to help uninsured and underinsured people afford their medications. But everyone can use the card – even people with insurance or are enrolled in other prescription drug card programs. Plus, the card may be used to achieve significant savings on diabetic supplies, subscription eyeglasses, hearing aids as well as Lasik eye surgery and teeth whitening procedures.

How much will it cost?

Participation in the program will not cost the city anything, nor will it cost your residents to enroll. The Tennessee Drug Card program is absolutely *FREE*. There are no premiums or deductibles associated with this program whatsoever. Printable cards are available free of charge from our website.

Why should I do it? Who benefits?

Frequently Asked Questions from Citizens

How much does the Tennessee Drug Card membership card cost?

The Tennessee Drug Card program is absolutely FREE. There are no premiums or deductibles associated with this program whatsoever. Printable cards are available free of charge from our website.

Once I have a card, what do I do? How do I use it?

- 1. Select a pharmacy:** Tennessee Drug Card is valid at more than 56,000 network pharmacy locations nationwide. In most cases, your current pharmacy will be part of our network.
- 2. Submit your prescription:** Present your prescription to the pharmacist. If you need to transfer a prescription, bring your empty prescription bottle or label with you to the pharmacy.
- 3. Present Tennessee Drug Card:** Your card's unique code provides the pharmacist with the appropriately discounted prescription price. The price on the prescription is based on the pharmacy's contracted agreement with Tennessee Drug Card and our partners.
- 4. You Save:** Your savings will be clear once the pharmacist enters your filled prescription into the register. Whether the lowest discount price is the Tennessee Drug Card's price, your present insurance program's price, or the pharmacy's already discounted price, you are GUARANTEED to receive the LOWEST price available!

What can I buy using the card?

The Tennessee Drug Card Program covers all FDA approved brand name and generic prescription medications written by a doctor. Plus, the card may be used to achieve significant savings on diabetic supplies, subscription eyeglasses, hearing aids as well as Lasik eye surgery and teeth whitening procedures.

How much will I save?

The program provides savings of up to 75%. For the year 2011 the average savings was 32% off retail pricing for brand and generic drug prescriptions.

What if I have insurance? Can I use it with my current insurance plan?
