Professional Services Agreement (COF Contract No 2009-0021) with Smith Seckman Reid, Inc. (SSR) to Add Resident Project Inspection Services for the Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No. 2 Upgrades (COF Construction Contract No 2009-0089) in an Amount

Not to Exceed \$72,000

### <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this memo is to provide information to the Franklin Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the consideration of a PSA with SSR for resident project inspection services for the Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No. 2 Upgrades Project.

#### Background

On November 24, 2009, the City of Franklin received, opened, and publically read the submitted bids for the construction services to upgrades the Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No. 2. The low bid of \$514,088 was submitted by L&C Contractors, Inc. The City has an existing contract with SSR for the design services of the Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No. 2 (COF Contract No 2009-0021). The proposed action will amend this PSA to provide for resident inspection services to ensure the upgrades are completed according to approved plans and specifications.

The City has approved an Interlocal Agreement with Williamson County for the Meadowgreen Subdivision Area Sanitary Sewer Project. The Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No.2 along with the discharging Force Main requires some rehabilitation and upsizing in order to handle the anticipated sewage flow expected from this system. Pursuant to this agreement, the City shall seek reimbursement for the proposed PSA from Williamson County.

### **Financial Impact**

The not-to-exceed cost for resident inspection services as negotiated with SSR is \$72,000. Per agreement, this cost will be reimbursed by Williamson County.

## **Options**

- 1. Approve the amendment to the existing PSA as described above with SSR.
- 2. Seek Request for Qualifications (RFQ) from consulting firms for the Professional Services Agreement required for the design of the work.
- 3. Perform the work with City Staff

## Recommendation

It is recommended that BOMA approve the proposed amendment to the PSA with SSR (COF Contract No. 2009-0021) to provide for resident inspection services for the Fieldstone Farms Pump Station No. 2 upgrades in the amount of \$72,000, to be reimbursed by Williamson County.

During the construction of the new wet well, pumps, generator, and other proposed site appurtenances, a resident project representative should be provided to ensure that the equipment, structures, and utility line work are installed per the plans and specifications. It is also important that someone is on site to keep an eye on the by-pass pumping operation. Due to the intricacy of the project, along with the proximity of the construction to existing Fieldstone Farm homes and greenway, we believe that a full-time resident project representative should be allotted for the project during all phases of the work. This person, whether a City of Franklin employee or someone from SSR, will need to be brought up to speed on the logistics of this project prior to the commencement of work.

We will make available technical field representatives suitable to fill this need if the City wishes. We are able to provide this employee at an hourly rate of \$60.00 per hour. We would anticipate the field representative to be on site full time for the duration of the 210 day (30 week) construction period. At 40 hours per 5 day week for 30 weeks, we estimate the cost to be approximately \$72,000.00.

Again, as an alternative, if the City has personnel that they wish to see on the project, Smith Seckman Reid, Inc. would certainly work with these personnel throughout the construction period. I would like to reiterate though that, whether the City provides their own resident project representative or contracts with SSR to do so, a full-time person should be designated for this project to ensure that the project is built according to plans and specifications and that day-to-day communication with the all project parties and the area residents is ongoing.

We are willing to work with the City in any way to ensure that this project proceeds as scheduled and will be happy to speak with you regarding other options for resident project representative services as you may wish.
