**TRAINING POLICY:**

All beer applications must have a training policy submitted with application. This policy must include training regarding the sale of beer to minors.

19. Please read the following and upon signature of this application, you do understand and agree to comply if you are granted a permit.

- (a) You will not sell beer or similar beverages except at the place or places for which the beer board has issued your permit.
- (b) You will not sell beer or any like beverage except in accordance with the terms of said permit.
- (c) If this application is made for permit to sell and not for consumption on the premises, you will not sell for consumption on the premises and not allow consumption on the premises.
- (d) You will rigidly enforce the law against sales to minors.
- (e) You will prohibit gambling at your establishment and understand that the conduct of such activities on the premises will result in revocation of your permit.
- (f) You will secure a certificate or statement from the health department or health officer that the premises covered by the application meet the requirements of the ordinances of the City of Franklin and the laws of the State of Tennessee.
- (g) You will not attempt to transfer this permit to anyone else.
- (h) You will display this permit in a prominent place in your establishment.
- (i) You will not sell or distribute beer between the hours of 3:00 AM and 6:00 AM (8:00 AM for on premises consumption) during the week and between the hours of 3:00 AM Sunday and 12:00 Noon Sunday (10:00 AM for on premises consumption).
- (j) You will prohibit the congregation at your establishment of those who reasonably appear to be intoxicated, lawless, rowdy, or prostitutes.
- (k) You will not allow any liquor with alcoholic content of greater than five percent (5%) to be consumed on the premises.

- (l) You will not allow any sale or delivery of beer for consumption on the premises outside of the building, it being the intention to prohibit the sale of beer by what is commonly known as "curb service" or "curb sales" of beer.
- (m) You will comply with all requirements of section 2-201 through 2-229 of the municipal code of the City of Franklin.

A non-refundable \$250 fee must accompany this application and the application shall be submitted at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Beer Board meeting at which it is to be considered. If the application is approved you are required to provide documentation of sales tax registration to the city within ten days of approval. Any applicant making false statement in this application shall forfeit his permit and shall not be eligible to receive any permit for a period of ten years.

A privilege tax of \$100 is imposed on the business of selling, distributing, storing or manufacturing beer in this state effective January 1, 1994 and each successive January 1. Any holder of a beer permit issued after January 1, 1994 shall pay a pro rata portion of this annual tax when the permit is issued.

*I hereby make application to the City of Franklin Beer Board for a beer permit.*

*The signing of this application acknowledges that I am aware of the laws prohibiting the sale of beer to minors.*

*I hereby certify that no person having at least a 5% ownership interest, nor any person to be employed in the distribution or sale of beer in my establishment has been convicted of any violation of the beer or alcoholic beverage laws or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past 10 years.*

*I am also aware that I shall not be issued a permit or my permit shall be revoked if my business location causes traffic congestion or interferes with schools, churches, or other public places of public gathering, or otherwise interferes with public health, safety and morals.*

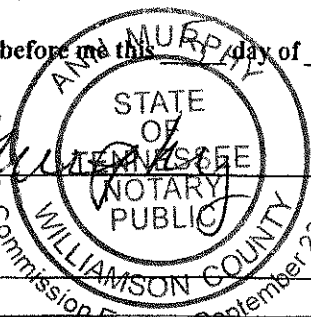

## SAL'S FAMILY PIZZA

### EMPLOYEE TRAINING MANUAL (Beer Sales)

#### I. Responsible Alcohol Service

Some states require a picture ID for all persons drinking alcohol, regardless of age. Sal's Family Pizza requires that all guests be required to show proper ID prior to being served alcohol.

Beer is sold for on premises consumption only and can not be sold for off premises consumption or on a to-go basis.

#### II. Acceptable Forms of Identification

- Driver's license with photograph
- State issued identification only cards
- Passport
- Active military ID

#### III. Policies Concerning Responsible Alcohol Service

- The sale of alcohol to minors is prohibited--
- The legal age to purchase alcohol is twenty-one (21) years--
- No person under twenty-one (21) years of age will be served alcohol--
- Employees must ID anyone attempting to purchase alcohol--
- The service of alcohol to anyone who is visibly intoxicated is unlawful, and therefore prohibited--
- Managers will visit any customer who has been served two (2) drinks within a one (1) hour period in order to evaluate whether the customer is intoxicated--
- All employees must report incidents to a manager and document the incidents in an Incident Log, with documentation, if any, within one (1) hour of the occurrence of the incident--

- Employees will offer to call a taxi cab for any intoxicated customer (at the customer's expense)--
- Employees will not physically restrain an intoxicated customer to prevent the customer from leaving the establishment--
- Employees will immediately notify a manager and will call the police in the event any intoxicated customer leaves the establishment and gets behind the wheel of a motor vehicle.

#### IV. Alcohol Service and Tennessee Law

- Be aware that laws regarding alcohol service vary from state to state. It is a requirement that you attend the training course offered by the Alcoholic Beverage Commission, and it is your responsibility to become familiar with the local alcohol ordinances--
- It is illegal to serve anyone under the age of twenty-one (21) years--
- Sal's policy requires that you ID each person who orders an alcoholic beverage--
- If a guest does not have an acceptable government-issued photo ID, then the guest can not be served alcohol (other forms of ID may be approved by a manager--
- No alcoholic beverage may be served to any table where one of the customers is under the age of twenty-one (21) years unless the underage person is accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or spouse who is over said minimum age--
- It is illegal to serve anyone who is intoxicated, and you are to use your best judgment on that matter--
- The consumption of two (2) beers during a one (1) hour period by a normal person weighing 115 pounds will yield a .1% blood alcohol level that is in excess of the legal limit in Tennessee which is .08% concentration (blood or breath). A single beer is normally metabolized in approximately one hour--
- It is illegal to serve anyone to the point of intoxication--
- If a customer (or employee) is obviously intoxicated, it is your responsibility, by law, to ensure the person's safety. This is true even if the person was intoxicated before entering Sal's and consumed no alcohol on our premises--

- Tennessee law may allow you to refuse alcohol service to anyone, but you must notify a manager that you have done so--
- People have different tolerances for alcohol, and you should be aware of any of these changes in their behavior: over friendliness, moodiness, bragging and talking loudly, arguing or annoying other guests, complaints that drinks are too weak, complaints about slow service, gulping/rapid drinking, buying drinks for strangers, lighting more than one cigarette, glassy eyes, slurred speech, staggering, spilling drinks, cursing or marked sleepiness--
- By law, you are not allowed to “stack” drinks. There can be served only one drink to a customer at a time--
- No doubles will be allowed at “last call”--
- Always communicate a customer’s drink consumption history when the shift changes--
- Encourage food consumption before a customer orders one drink too many--
- Discourage “power drinking”--
- A decision to discontinue alcohol service to a customer, made by a manager, will be observed by all personnel. Failure to do so may result in immediate termination. If you believe a customer should be “cut-off,” notify a manager immediately--
- Never offer single-priced, unlimited service drink specials or give free drinks to customers, or encourage or promote any organized game which awards alcohol as a prize or promotes excessive drinking. Do not offer “Happy Hour” specials after 10:00 o’clock p.m.


