SUBJECT: Report of bid award to Fasttek Electrocoating of Trufant, Michigan in the total lump sum amount of \$18,076.90 for electrostatic painting of certain downtown traffic signal and street light components at a total of eleven (11) job sites for the Traffic Division of the Streets Department (Purchasing Office Procurement Solicitation No. 2013-007; \$25,000 budgeted in 110-89470-43110 for fiscal year 2013; Contract No. 2013-0054)

Purpose

The purpose of this procurement is to engage a qualified contractor to provide electrostatic painting of certain downtown traffic signal and street light components at a total of eleven (11) job sites for the Traffic Division of the Streets Department.

Background

The City published on April 4, 2013 a Notice to Bidders in the *Williamson Herald* for electrostatic painting of certain traffic signal and street light components. In addition, bid documents were sent on or about the same date directly to eight (8) potential bidders known or thought to be interested in this solicitation. Bids from two (2) vendors were publicly opened at the bid opening held on April 30, 2013. A tabulation of the bids received for this solicitation is attached.

Financial Impact

The apparent lowest, most responsive and responsible bid, from Fasttek Electrocoating of Trufant, Michigan, is in the total lump sum amount of \$18,076.90 for the specified eleven (11) job sites. This bid was identified because it is the lowest bid that meets or exceeds the City's intention as expressed and implied by the City's specifications as well as the instructions, terms and conditions pertaining to this procurement solicitation. The Streets Department Traffic Division budget for fiscal year 2013 allocates \$25,000 out of the General Fund for this project. The Fasttek Electrocoating bid amount is \$6,923.10 (28%) under budget.

Options

In accordance with the bid documents, the City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Recommendation

Because the apparent lowest, most responsive and responsible bid is less than \$25,000, staff has accepted that bid, from Fasttek Electrocoating of Trufant, Michigan, in the total lump sum amount of \$18,076.90 for the specified eleven (11) job sites. Purchasing Manager Brian Wilcox is of the opinion that the prepared specifications as distributed allowed for competition among multiple vendors, and that the staff decision appears to be made in a fair and impartial manner based upon the bids received.

SUBJECT: Report of bid award to ESC Lab Sciences of Mt. Juliet, TN in the total estimated amount based upon specified estimated quantities of \$3,200 per year for aquatic toxicity (biomonitoring) testing contract services, for the Water Reclamation Division of the Water Management Department (Purchasing Office Procurement Solicitation No. 2013-018; \$150,000 budgeted in 431-82280-52213 for all outsourced water reclamation lab services for fiscal year 2013; Contract No. 2013-0056)

Purpose

The purpose of this procurement is to contract with a qualified laboratory for aquatic toxicity (biomonitoring) testing services for a minimum of twelve (12) months effective July 1, 2013, with two options to extend the term of award for up to twelve (12) additional months each option, for the Water Reclamation Division of the Water Management Department. Pricing is to be established on a unit pricing basis.

Background

The City published on April 11, 2013 a Notice to Bidders in the *Williamson Herald* for the following wastewater treatment laboratory contract services for a minimum of twelve (12) months: (A) industrial pretreatment sampling and testing, and Water Reclamation Facility influent and effluent testing (Purchasing Office Solicitation No. 2013-017); and (B) aquatic toxicity (biomonitoring) testing (Purchasing Office Solicitation No. 2013-018); each being bid independently. In addition, bid documents were sent on or about the same date directly to four (4) potential bidders known or thought to be interested in this solicitation. Bids from two (2) vendors were publicly opened at the bid opening held on April 30, 2013. A tabulation of the bids received for this solicitation is attached.

Financial Impact

The apparent lowest, most responsive and responsible bid, from ESC Lab Sciences of Mt. Juliet, TN is in the total estimated amount based upon specified estimated quantities of \$3,200 per year for the specified services. This bid was identified because it is the lowest bid that meets or exceeds the City's intention as expressed and implied by the City's specifications as well as the instructions, terms and conditions pertaining to this procurement solicitation. The Water Management Department Water Reclamation Division budget for fiscal year 2013 allocates \$150,000 out of the Wastewater Fund for the purchase of all outsourced water reclamation lab services. The fiscal year 2014 budget has not yet been approved.

Options

In accordance with the bid documents, the City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
