Chairman Elliott called to approve the minutes of the March 14, 2013 regular meeting; Mr. Dale

OLD BUSINESS

5. Year-to-Date Financial Statement and Summary

(ITEM #5)

Ms. Henry presented the year to date April 30, 2013 financial statements to the Authority, noting that numbers are tracking well; 84% revenues, 84% expenses, with 83% of the year elapsed. Ms. Henry pointed out the increase revenues in transit fares and contracts. She also reminded the Authority that the increase in service equated increased expenses. There were also unexpected expenses that could not be budgeted such as the increase in audit fees, and a server replacement. Chairman Preston Elliott called for acceptance of the financial report. *Mr. Dale Thomas motioned, Mr. Bob Horner seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.*

6. Transit Report (ITEM #6)

Ms. Henry reported the ridership. Ridership and Fare Box continues to rise succulently. Chairman Preston Elliott called for acceptance of the transit report. *Mr. Dale Thomas motioned, Mr. Bob Horner seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.*

7. Communications-Outreach Report

Deborah Varallo (Varallo Public Relations) shared with the Authority update about the successful Share-the-Ride event on April 17, where area Mayors and governmental leaders rode Franklin Transit TODD, RTA 91X, and VanStar regional commuter vanpool program to April's monthly regional meetings held in Nashville.

NEW BUSINESS

8. Consideration of Updated Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)

(BAI 05-16-13-7)

Ms. Henry refreshed the Authority about the February BAI regarding the updated DBE goal for FFY 13-15. At that time, it was the Authority's direction, after the required 45-day public comment period, the Authority would review any comments. Ms. Henry shared that no public comments were received. Therefore, staff recommended that the Franklin Transit Authority accepted the updated DBE goal for FFY 2013-15 of 1%. Ms. Pearl Bransford motioned, Mr. Bob Horner seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9. Ethics Refresher Training, Kristen Corn – City of Franklin Staff Attorney

Ms. Corn led Authority members through a thorough presentation regarding ethics compliance.

Ms. Henry stated that the transit budget has been absorbed into the COF total budget and that the entire budget will begin the process of three readings at May 28th BOMA meeting. Alderman Bransford thanked TMA staff for a professional and well-done presentation to the BOMA Finance and Budget Committee of the Franklin Transit budget.

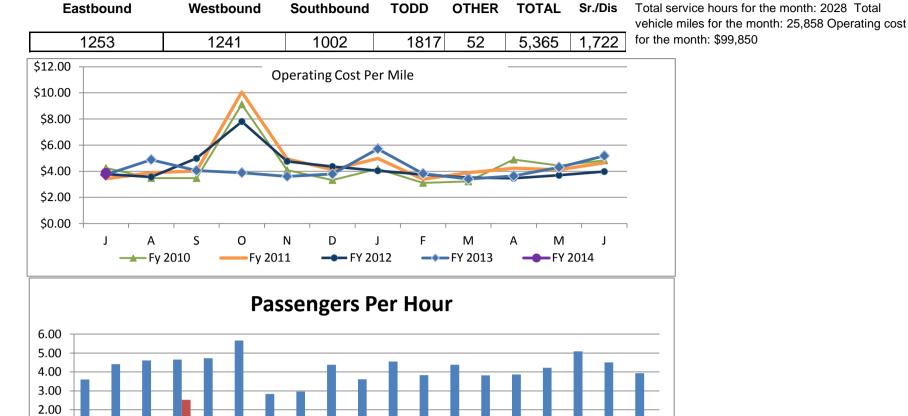

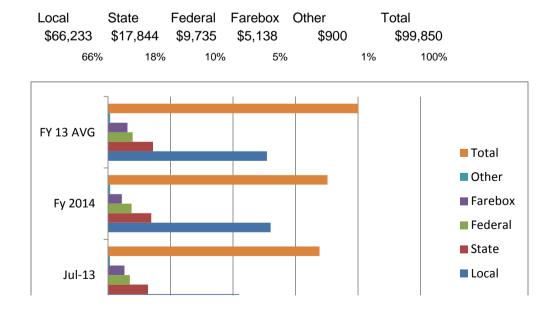

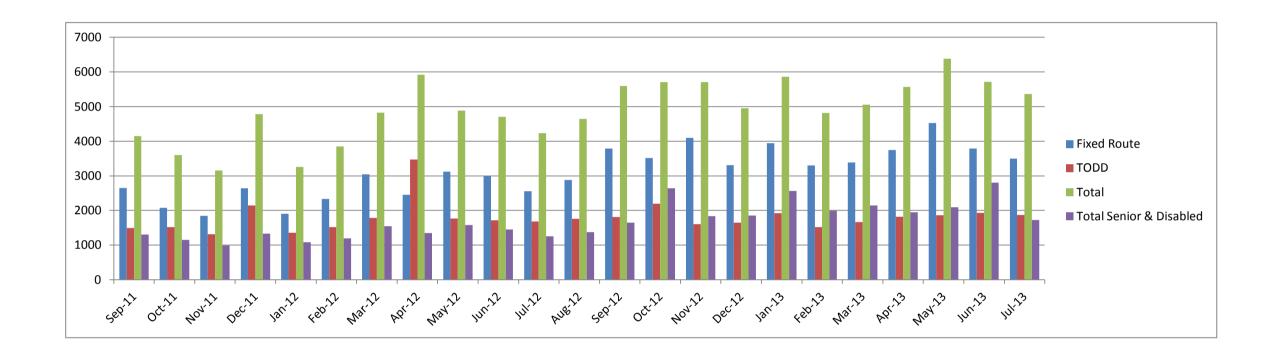

Section I: Discover Transit Basics

- 1. What are the different forms of mass transit nationally and in your community?
- 2. Learn about safety: when walking, bicycling, riding the bus, and when riding your bike around transit vehicles and when taking your bike on the bus.
- 3. Pick up or download a transit schedule from your local transit authority.
- 4. Learn about the benefits transit can have for you, your family, and your community.
- 5. Learn how walking, biking, or using mass transit helps the environment.
- 6. Find out what your city, county and state government is doing to improve alternative transportation with regard to bus improvements, bike routes, pedestrian safety, etc.

Section II: Connect

- 1. Identify at least four different road signs and other safety measures that you may find near bus stops, pedestrian crossings, and rail crossings.
- 2. Figure out how to get to one of your daily activities (attending school, after-school activities, after-school job) by using transit to get to and from those locations.
- 3. With a parent, ride a transit bus or trolley to one of your regular destinations (for example, school, the YMCA, the grocery store or your doctor's office).
- 4. With a parent, safely take your bike on a Franklin Transit vehicle.
- 5. Take a tour of the Franklin Transit Authority, the Music City Star station, or other mass-transit office.

Section III: Share!

- For Daisy and Brownie: Draw a picture and write (or have an adult help you write) a few sentences about what you have learned about transportation. Which mode of transportation is your favorite? Share your drawing and ideas with your troop. For Junior, Cadette and Senior: Write a few paragraphs detailing what you learned about transportation; share it with your troop.
- 2. Get creative and organize a neighborhood event encouraging your neighbors to leave their cars at home and use alternative transportation for one day. Remember to share what you have learned about the benefits of transit!
- 3. Film or record a public service announcement for your community about pedestrian, bicycle, bus or rail safety.
- 4. Create a photo slideshow, scrapbook, or short video to share what you have learned about transportation in your community.

- 5. Distribute Franklin Transit schedules and (safety/other) materials at your school or church.
- 6. Create a poster encouraging your community to use transit. Display your poster at school, church, or a local business.
- 7. Create a "walking school bus" (see video link) or schedule a "Walk to School Day" with your school. Hint: You may also combine other modes of transit (Franklin Transit bus, bicycle) to get to your destination.

AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT FOR EQUIPMENT

COF Contract No. 2013-0123

This Amendment is the First Amendment to the Lease Agreement for Equipment effective October 1, 2010 ("Lease Agreement"), by the Franklin Transit Authority of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, ("the Authority") and the City of Franklin, a municipal corporation created and existing under the laws of the state of Tennessee ("the City").

WHEREAS, the Authority presently provides trolley service within the City and fully manages the existing assets and assuming the operations of the trolley system with financial support from the City; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has leased from the City the vehicles for the Authority's fleet since 2006, and both parties desire to continue this arrangement, and the parties desire to amend the Lease Agreement to update the existing list of leased vehicles and to extend the term of the Lease for an additional five (5) years from the date of execution of this Amendment.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Paragraph 1, "Equipment and Rent,"

The City hereby leases to the Authority and the Authority hereby leases from the City the vehicles ("trolleys" or "equipment") listed in the attached Exhibit A, as amended, that includes trolleys and a wheelchair-accessible van. The Authority will pay the City of Franklin a lump sum of \$100.00 annually to the City of Franklin as a total rental fee for all equipment listed in Exhibit A, as amended. A financial statement shall continue to be submitted by the 15th of the month for the previous month's period for the duration of this agreement to the City Finance Department. The Authority shall provide a complete inventory of all equipment annually to the City on or before June 30th. Exhibit A may be amended as necessary as agreed to by both parties in writing.

- 2. Paragraph 2, "Term," shall be revised by extending the term of the Lease Agreement for an additional five (5) years from the date of execution of this Amendment, unless terminated earlier by either party with ninety (90) days notice.
- 3. All other terms of the Lease Agreement not expressly modified in this Amendment remain in full force and effect.

The review determines whether a grantee is administering its FTA-funded programs in accordance with 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, Federal transit law provisions. In 2003, the Franklin Transit Authority approved the Operating Plan for Franklin Transit, with revisions in 2006 and 2010. In keeping with the updates and revisions of policies and procedures issued by Federal Transit Administration, the addition of a Goal for the Vehicle Maintenance Program (Chapter 5) of Operating Plan is required. Language to be added states: "Goal: To provide the maintenance to vehicles in a proactive and cost effective way, maintaining an "In Service" bench mark rate exceeding the industry standard of 80%. STAFF RECOMMENDATION Staff recommends, to ensure compliance with Federal Transit Administration requirements, the Franklin Transit Authority approve the addition language to the Vehicle Maintenance Program portion of existing Operating Plan.
