  - Lauren Lexa, 2201 Skylark Court, Boyd Mill Estates, expressed concern regarding removal of the tree line between Tywater Crossing and Boyd Mill Estates. She wants the trees protected. Stakes have been placed at different intervals on what she and others in the subdivision thought was open space. The property owner on the other side indicated the reason for the removal of some of the trees is that there is nowhere for their grandchildren to play. Nothing has ever been said about property lines, and she thought the fence row and trees were the dividing property line. She thought it should be brought to BOMA's attention. When she e-mailed the City about the stakes, she was told

- the City doesn't get into property line disputes with homeowners. Mayor Moore indicated he would see that staff contacted her with an answer.
- Sam Whitson, 803 Fair Street, read a prepared statement concerning the unintended consequences of any modification of current zoning requirements on the parking and storage of RVs, boats, campers and other large vehicles in City residential areas. He doesn't think it is fair to change a long standing zoning requirement based on one complaint. (Statement filed with the minutes)

13. <u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> Consideration of RESOLUTION 2013-17, A Resolution to Approve the Development Plan for the Artessa PUD Subdivision, Including Consideration of Two Modifications of Standards and One Amendment, On ±11.21 Acres for the Property Located at 1034 & 1035 Windcross Court

#### Public Hearing:

- Sam Gant, 580 Jordan Road, expressed safety and traffic concerns if the access at Jordan Road would be anything other than emergency access. He asked that BOMA grant emergency access only.
- Tracy Ledbetter, 101 Wynthrope Way, voiced concern for pedestrian traffic on Jordan Road. It is a park-like setting with people walking and running in the middle of the road. Drivers already speed on that road. She is in favor of an emergency exit only.
- Jimmie Tullis, 604 Jordan Road, spoke in favor of the access being for emergency access only for safety reasons. He asked that BOMA consider a siren activated gate. He mentioned that some neighbors did not get advance notice of this meeting.
- Brandon Baisden, 109 Wynthrope Way, agreed with the previous speakers that the access be for emergency only.

With no one else coming forth to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing closed

Alderman Burger moved to approve Resolution 2013-17. Seconded by Alderman Skinner.

Alderman Martin moved to approve MOS 1: Retaining Wall. Request to apply the nonresidential retaining wall standards, rather than the residential retaining wall standards. Seconded by Alderman Blanton. Motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Bransford moved to approve MOS 2: Building Length. Request to increase the maximum permitted building length from 200 feet to 236 feet. Seconded by Alderman Petersen. Motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Burger moved to approve Condition 1: Request to limit access to the site from Jordan Road to an Emergency Access only; and, amend the staff conditions to remove the requirements to construct an additional right turn lane at the intersection of Jordan Road and McEwen Drive. The sidewalk and lighting requirement should remain as a requirement of the development. Seconded by Alderman Petersen.

Alderman Burger was in favor of adding a siren activated gate as requested by a citizen. Vice Mayor McLendon supported the condition. He was not in favor of adding a siren to a limited emergency only controlled access. Further discussion ensued.

Motion to approve Condition 1 carried unanimously.

Motion to approve Resolution 2013-17 as thrice amended carried unanimously.

#### Public Hearing:

• Carol Chapman, 3001 Del Rio Pike (next door to the Lynch property) voiced concern about the 6 ft. board fence proposed as a barrier between her property and the development. There are no other wooden fences in the area; trees mark other property lines. She doesn't think it would look right and added there are beautiful pine trees lining one-third of the line and that is what she would prefer or a berm. Something other than a 6 ft. wooden fence.

With no one else coming forth to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing closed

Alderman Barnhill noted there had been lengthy discussion on this at a previous workshop. This is such a significant change that it would have to go back to the Planning Commission. The developer is agreeable to change to another option such as berm or trees, and said Mrs. Chapman is agreeable to that.
