## **RESOLUTION 2014-13**

## A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE FUNDING PLAN FOR THE FY 2014-2018 CIP (CAPITAL INVESTMENT PROGRAM)

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) has determined that the FY 2014-2018 Capital Investment Program (CIP) as has been presented represents their intent as to the capital projects needing to be accomplished within the next several years; and

WHEREAS, the BOMA has reviewed the FY 2014-2018 CIP and ranked its top ten (10) priority projects for consideration of funding; and

WHEREAS, the BOMA employed The PFM Group, a financial advisory firm, to develop a "Debt Capacity Model Update" to model three (3) scenarios of debt capacity based on the "Debt Affordability Ratios" as previously established by the BOMA; and

WHEREAS, the BOMA accepted Scenario 3 from the PFM Debt Capacity Model Update as presented to the BOMA on September 25, 2013, as the preferred funding plan going forward with the funding for existing capital projects, a Ten Million Dollar (\$10,000,000) Pension Obligation Bond and an additional amount of up to Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) for capital projects through General Obligation Bonds; and

WHEREAS, City Staff has recommended and presented to the BOMA for consideration certain CIP projects for funding utilizing Facility Tax Revenues, Hotel/Motel Tax Revenues, or General Obligation Bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE, that the following FY 2014-2018 CIP projects be approved for funding utilizing the funding source as recommended and indicated below for each project:
