Purpose

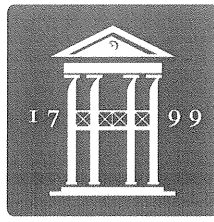
The purpose of this memorandum is to outline recommendations to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for a Retail License application received for an existing liquor store.

**RETAILER'S CERTIFICATE
(RENEWAL)**

Pursuant to T.C.A. §57-3-208, the City of Franklin hereby certifies the following facts concerning Thomas Michael Klaritch, who has made application for a retailer's license to handle alcoholic beverages at, Case Selects Wines and Liquors, LLC, 3046 Columbia Avenue, Franklin, Tennessee 37064, which is within the corporate limits of the City of Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee:

1. The applicant or applicants who are to be in actual charge of the business have not been convicted of a felony within a ten year period immediately preceding the date of application, and in the opinion of the undersigned, the applicant will not violate any of the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, Chapter 3.
2. The applicant(s) has secured a location for the business which complies with all restrictions of local law, ordinance, or resolution, duly adopted by the local authorities as to location.
3. The applicant(s) meets all residency requirements established by local authority under Franklin Municipal Code Section 2-108A.
