Purpose

The purpose of this memo is to provide information to the Franklin Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the consideration of an amendment to the PSA with Jackson Thornton for Water Treatment Plant Feasibility Analysis performed in 2008-09. The amendment provides for additional charges due to extra work performed over the course of the project.

Background

During the course of the Water Treatment Plant Feasibility Analysis, Jackson Thornton provided services beyond the original scope to include a comprehensive review of the assumptions, additional work anticipated for review and presentation of results, and the development and presentation of an alternate economic analysis to determine impacts on water rates. It is very regrettable that due to various oversights, this information is just now being provided to the BOMA.
