2040 Regional Transportation Plan Call-for-Projects

Purpose

FROM:

The purpose of this memo is to provide the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) with information about the City's recent response to the Nashville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) 2040 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Call-for-Projects.

Information

The MPO describes the Regional Transportation Plan as follows:

"The MPO's Regional Transportation Plan establishes guiding principles, goals and objectives for the enhancement of Middle Tennessee's transportation system over the next 25 years. It details a multi-modal strategy to support the economic growth and prosperity goals of the region's communities, while dealing with the problems of future congestion, concerns for the health, safety and security of travelers, as well as the negative effects that system expansion has on the natural and socio-cultural environment."

The RTP is typically updated on a 5-year cycle, with the last update being adopted in 2010 (2035 RTP). These 25 year plans include 3 planning horizons: short-term (first 5 years), mid-term (middle 10 years) and long-term (final 10 years). The projects included in the short-term horizon will be listed in the MPO's regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). In short, the MPO's RTP and TIP processes are the City's "gateway" to state and federal funding programs.

On June 18, 2014, at its Executive Board Meeting, the MPO announced the official Call-for-Projects for the 2040 RTP. At this first stage of the process, the MPO requested the following information from each member agency represented at the MPO:

- Prioritized list of projects listed in the current TIP and RTP with information about their status
 and an indication of plans to resubmit for the new TIP or RTP. This list, as submitted by the City
 of Franklin, is attached as Exhibit A.
- Prioritized list of additional/new projects to be submitted for consideration. This list, as submitted by the City of Franklin, is attached as Exhibit B.



The major milestones and deadlines that remain in the preparation and adoption of the 2040 RTP are:

September 30, 2014	\rightarrow	Final deadline: State and local government members to submit complete project proposals through the online application system (coming soon).
September 2014 – October 2014	→	County workshops: Review and discuss existing and future transportation needs, project proposals, and planning process with local elected officials, business leaders, and community partners.
October 1, 2014	→	MPO Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) workshop on revenue forecasts and project evaluation criteria.
November 12, 2014	→	Joint TCC/Board Meeting: Endorse 2040 guiding principles, goals, and objectives; candidate projects; and priorities for the TDOT 3-year work program.
November 2014 – December 2015	\rightarrow	MPO evaluation, optimization, and prioritization of candidate projects.
February 2015	\rightarrow	Endorse 25-year regional priorities; fiscally-constrained project list.
March 2015 – April 2015	\rightarrow	Draft 2040 Plan Document.
April 2015 – July 2015	\rightarrow	State & federal compliance review.
November 2015	\rightarrow	Joint TCC/Executive Board Meeting: Endorsement of 2040 Plan.
November 2015 – December 2015	\rightarrow	Public review & comment period.
December 2015	\rightarrow	Adoption hearings.

This is an extensive process. However, the City's participation is critical in addressing the transportation needs of the region and securing funding for local transportation projects.
