**McEwen Phase 4 presentation.** Attached is the presentation provided by City staff at the meeting hosted last week (Thursday, 2/9) for HOA leaders. We expect to have a contract from TDOT for the acceptance of the \$10 Million of grants funds for McEwen 4 within the next few weeks. The presentation includes a timeline with and without the federal/state funds. The additional requirements associated with grant funds could add between 15 and 33 months to the project timeline.

**Public Open House for Riverfront Study – Feb. 27**th. The date for the Riverfront Planning Study public open house will be **Monday, February 27** in the hallway of City Hall. **There will be two opportunities: 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.** In addition to standard public newspaper and website notice, twenty signs will be posted throughout Central Franklin and letters will be mailed to each property owner along the River within the study boundaries, between Bicentennial and Pinkerton Parks. Staff is currently working on the structure of questioning to solicit community feedback on visioning for the River walk and perspectives on development within the floodplain.
