After an extensive selection process, I am pleased to announce the appointment of **Mark Hilty as our new Assistant City Administrator for Public Works**. The Assistant City Administrator for Public Works will be responsible for the leadership and management of four key service departments: Streets, Parks, Water Management, and Sanitation and Environmental Services. Mark joined the City of Franklin team in 2006 becoming Water Management Director in 2007. As Water Management Director, Mark has been responsible for planning and directing all Water Management operations and administration, leading a team of 85 staff. Hilty helped lead the development of the City's Integrated Water

Management Plan (IWRP) which provided a 30-year "blue print" for the management of all facets of water resources including drinking water, wastewater, reclaimed water, and stormwater. The IWRP focuses on sustainability and stewardship of our natural resources, including extensive modeling regarding the community's impact on the Harpeth River. The plan which is the first of its kind in Tennessee. Hilty has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Connecticut and is a veteran of the U.S. Army infantry. Mark has been an excellent leader for Water Management over the past 10 years and I look forward to his future contributions in leading our Public Works team. Mark and our team share a deep commitment to providing excellent service to our citizens and to planning for the long term needs of our growing, prosperous community. Congrats, Mark!
