The Franklin Police Department will hold an **employee Active Shooter training seminar on Monday, November 6, in the City Hall Board room from 9-10:30 a.m.** The class is designed to help keep citizens safe during active shooter situations in public places. Franklin Police Officers will share ways to improve their response to an unforeseen, mass violence encounter. During our one and a half hour seminar, officers will discuss three main, national best practices:

Run, Hide/Barricade, Fight. Please check with your supervisor if you can attend.

The Franklin Fire Department has won an award for active shooter training. The Department is receiving an award at the **World Emergency Medical Service Conference** this week. The award recognizes specialized training developed by the FFD for active shooter situations.
