Congratulations to **all our City Departments**! The **National Research Center, Inc.** (NRC) has announced Franklin the

winner of the **Voice of the People Award for Excellence in Education and Enrichment**. This award is only given to top performing jurisdictions that best listen and act for the benefit their communities. Based on responses from The National Citizen Survey™ residents in our community reported the highest ratings for this category compared with all other participating jurisdictions. The National Citizen Survey™ reports resident opinion and satisfaction with local

government and services with a scientific, representative sample approach. Results are then used to inform budgeting, performance measurement and program planning. The Voice of the People Awards stand alone as the only award given in local government based on community opinion. The perspectives of the residents themselves determine nominees for the very best of Community Engagement, Safety, Mobility, Foundations of Livability, Recreation and Wellness, Education and Enrichment, Natural Environment, Built Environment and Economy. Of the communities that participated in The National Citizen Survey in 2016, winners and finalists for Excellence in these categories received the highest overall levels of satisfaction from residents.

Congratulations to **Parks Director Lisa Clayton** who received top honor in the state at the **Tennessee Recreation and Parks Association Conference** (TRPA) here in Franklin this



week. Lisa was awarded the **Fellow Award**. This award is the highest honor the association can give to an individual. Since 1972 this award has recognized professional members of TRPA that have made

outstanding contributions to the parks, recreation and conservation field over and above their normal and expected duties. Our **Parks team** did a fabulous job planning and

working the conference. Our **Communications team** also assisted with videos and volunteering at the conference. Close to 400 attendees were in Franklin. This week the City of Franklin launched the new **anti-litter campaign** targeted at both the general public and at contractors/waste haulers. The campaign was developed by the **Sanitation and Environmental Services (SES) Department, our Communications team, and the City's Sustainability Commission.** The campaign to residents and visitors features a southern flair with humorous messages to grab people's attention. One ad reads, "Bless your heart is a southern expression. Littering ain't." Another ad says, "Y'all ain't right is a southern expression. Litter ain't." The graphics show retro photos of southern women with the saying in a word bubble, and a modern-day photo of litter or someone littering. The advertisement will be featured as a moving billboard on Franklin Sanitation trucks and social media and feature the hashtag **#stayclassynottrashyfranklin**. The campaign to local contractors will feature signage at construction sites and the Franklin Sanitation drop-off station, as well as educational materials at the City's **Building and Neighborhood Services Department**.
