


Friday, November 17, 2017

Congratulations to our Franklin TV team, **Stefan Juran, Stephen Price, and Robert Mott** who rolled LIVE on last week's **Veterans Day Parade** and broadcast the parade on **Facebook** and **YouTube.** The broadcast reached 19,738 people and received over 8,000 video views and 252 shares. People were watching from Texas, Florida, Kentucky, Alabama, Pennsylvania, Mississippi, Georgia, Maryland and North Carolina, with 84 percent of the viewers right here in Tennessee. This is the first time we've been able to go LIVE with a parade broadcast. You can see the other stats below! The Voice of the People Awards stand alone as the only award given in local government based on community opinion. The perspectives of the residents themselves determine nominees for the very best of Community Engagement, Safety, Mobility, Foundations of Livability, Recreation and Wellness, Education and Enrichment, Natural Environment, Built Environment and Economy.
