The judging was split into two categories this year with CAREER 1 recognized with facilities over 15,000 square feet and six honorable mentions and CAREER 2 are for stations under 15,000 square feet. In our category there was a Gold, Silver and Bronze winner with our facility being recognized as one of six honorable mentions. Also if you were not aware the

facility did reach a LEED SILVER recognition regarding design and construction. Not bad at all considering projects were submitted from all over the United States and Canada. Great job to Brad Wilson, Chief Garzarek and our Fire and Facilities Management teams.

Hillsboro Road is now fully open to traffic. Thanks to project manager William Banks and our Engineering team. This project was the second phase of the Hillsboro Road Improvements Project creating roadway and utility infrastructure upgrades. We experienced a few delays but overall this project enhances one of the major entryways into downtown Franklin. The project entailed Widening from a 2-lane roadway with shoulders to 3-lanes (includes a new center turn lane) with curb and gutter (widening is symmetrical along the

roadway's existing centerline); New 4.0' Bike lanes on both sides; New 3.0' grass strip with street trees; New 5.0' sidewalk along both sides of the roadway, up to 916/917 Hillsboro Road; New street lighting along both sides using decorative street light poles; Northbound right turn lanes (in addition to the 2 travel lanes and center turn lane) to be added in front of Franklin High School and at both of the Joel Cheek Blvd. and Claude Yates Drive Intersections; Installing a traffic control signal at Claude Yates Drive to help with Franklin High School Traffic; Upgrading the Joel Cheek Blvd. traffic signal; Relocating all overhead utilities into underground duct banks; Upgrading older and undersized water and sanitary sewer utility lines; and Installing a new storm water sewer system with catch basins and yard inlets. These upgrades take place in both State Rights-of-Way and City/Public Easements.

Recently, Alderman Clyde Barnhill and Finance's Michael Walters Young traveled to Gallatin to speak with their government leaders about that City's long-term strategic plan. Michael and Clyde shared our Franklin Forward Strategic Plan with the group. Gallatin Mayor Paige Brown mentioned traveling to Franklin in the near future with Gallatin's council members to see how City leaders implement Franklin Forward. Franklin Forward was established in 2013 and sets a unified vision for the future of the city measured in themes: safe, clean livable city, effective and fiscally sound city government providing high quality service, quality of life experiences and sustainable growth and economic prosperity.
