Pension Fund Report. Attached is the third quarter performance report for the **Employee Pension Fund** (through September 2017). The total portfolio is now \$102.2 million. Currently, \$91.4 million of the overall portfolio are is under the management of TCRS (Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System). Overall, our employee pension fund continues to be strong financially.

Last night, I joined several City of Franklin team members (including Alderman Brandy Blanton) and many citizens in "wrapping up" the Franklin Firefighters 10th Annual Toy and Clothing Drive at Station 5. More than 100 volunteers wrapped approximately 1,100 gifts for 220 Williamson County children in less than two hours! As you'll see in the photo below, my wife Lisa, daughter Beth, and I successfully wrapped a large beanbag chair proving that nothing is impossible with enough tape and paper! Thank you, Sarah Glenn, for this "special assignment!" The gifts will be distributed to the children next Thursday.
