Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam this week announced he has appointed a steering committee of leaders from federal, state and local governments, industry, academia, environmental advocacy groups and public utilities to develop a statewide plan for future water **availability in Tennessee**. Tennessee's population is estimated to double in the next 50 years. This growth, along with recent concerns over the utilization of the Memphis Sands Aguifer, droughts that have impacted numerous Tennessee communities, failures of aging drinking water and wastewater infrastructure, and interstate battles over water rights, all stress the need to develop a statewide plan for addressing water availability. **TN H20** will pay particular attention to surface and groundwater, water and wastewater infrastructure. water reuse and land conservation, as well as institutional and legal framework. Working groups composed of subject matter experts will conduct the research and gather information. The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) will oversee the development of TN H2O. We are proud to note that Mayor Moore was one of the people appointed to this very important committee! This is an important honor for our Mayor and also a recognition of the high level of planning that the City of Franklin has placed on the issue of meeting the water needs of our growing community. 
The following are a few Thank You notes we received last week.

Last night we heard what sounded like a loud clap of thunder in our back yard. Just before 10:30 pm. A vehicle had flown off Clovercroft Road right behind our house and down a ravine into the woods. I immediately called the Franklin police, and within just 2-3 minutes the Franklin fire department and police were on scene to rescue the driver. Was 10-15 degrees here last night when this happened. Rescue personnel performed well in the snow. A tow truck removed the vehicle from the woods dragging it up to Clovercroft Road within 1 hour of my calling the police.

Well done to the City of Franklin for their quick response in city limits during this cold winter weather. I assume the vehicle left the roadway due to the ice. Hope the driver is okay. An ambulance was on scene, too. Within less than 5 minutes after I called the Franklin PD, about a dozen rescue vehicles were on scene, closing Clovercroft Road.
