Open enrollment will be May 28th to June22nd. There are <u>no changes</u> in premiums for FY2019. The City is changing Option II coverage to a High Deductible Health Plan (HDHP) coupled with a Health Savings Account (HSA). An HDHP has a lower premium, but a higher deductible and out-of-pocket cost. Another change is vision insurance will be a standalone policy, so you can have Option II and enroll in vision coverage. Attached is a presentation explaining the new high deductible/HSA health insurance option. Any changes you make to your coverage, will be reflected in the first pay check received in July. If you have any questions please ask Human Resources.

In recognition of **National EMS Week** the Franklin Fire Department has created a visual display at Franklin Fire Station 2, located at 907 Murfreesboro Road. The 56 hearts in front of Station 2 represent the 5,676 emergency medical and rescue-related calls that Franklin Firefighters responded to in 2017 – a 13 percent increase over 2016. The Franklin Fire Department is an Advanced Life Support department, providing the highest level of prehospital emergency medical care to the community it serves. Franklin Fire Department is comprised of 157 sworn personnel, all of whom hold a medical license, including 51 paramedics, 74 Advanced EMT's, 18 EMT's and 14 Emergency Medical Responders.
