The City also won the prestigious **Tennessee City Management Association's** (TCMA)award for Municipal Excellence for our Envision Franklin land use plan. Congratulations to the Planning and Sustainability Department, the Planning



Commission, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen, and the many City team members who assisted in this important long-term planning effort. The release said, "The Envision Franklin plan articulates the long-term vision that will direct future development in a way that strengthens the city and creates exceptional places for people. Guiding principles and themes of the plan include managed growth, economic vitality, vibrant neighborhoods, historic preservation, natural beauty, exceptional design, connected community, and context-responsive

infill. The plan includes 17 keystone design concepts, each of which are mapped with desired land uses, building form, site design, transportation, and special considerations. The process brought together more than 250 citizens, developers, homeowner's associations, and other stakeholders to create a plan with clear and relevant guidance for the fast-growing community. City staff worked closely with the citizens over multiple neighborhood meetings to identify their vision for their community. Franklin also worked to develop programs that would improve service delivery to citizens as well as generate cost savings to the municipality. One of the major goals of Envision Franklin was directing growth in

such a way that it could be fostered by adequate infrastructure and services. Franklin worked with Smart Growth America to identify areas suitable for growth and then measures that would direct growth into those areas." This past Saturday, **Franklin Firefighters** conducted training for the local **Naval Sea Cadets** at the **Franklin Fire Training Center**. The Naval Sea Cadets is a program for young people, ages 11 – 18, that promotes interest and skill in naval disciplines through leadership development, technical training, and participation in local events. Treatment Plant upgrades this week. The new state-of-the-art equipment will increase the level of service to our city customers. The project began in early 2017, and will provide an increased level of service to city customers. The upgrades include Membrane Filtration that will remove finer particulates, and Granular Activated Carbon Contactors that will remove any taste and odor issues, and Ultra Violet/Advanced Oxidation for disinfection improvement. The Franklin Water Plant serves approximately 18,000 customers. This project is part of the Integrated Water Resource Plan (IWRP). The purpose of the IWRP project, drafted in 2012, is to develop and recommend an implementable and broadly supported plan to meet Franklin's water resources needs for the next 30 years. It was essential the plan be sustainable, cost-effective, permittable, and protect and enhance the Harpeth River.
