Franklin Police Department participated in the National Night Out event on Tuesday Night in eleven Franklin

Next Friday (August 17th), we will **officially open the new sidewalk on Murfreesboro (HWY 96E)**. This project has been in the works since 2014 when the City started the design of a sidewalk between Pinkerton Park and Mack Hatcher Parkway. After several community meetings and discussions with BOMA, construction began exactly one year ago (August 2017). The project includes 4,000 feet of new sidewalk, an open ditch drainage, crosswalks, and ADA-compliant ramps.
