- February 5th 19th Survey respondents notified & surveys mailed
- March 12th Survey opened online to all citizens to take
- March 26th Survey closed
- Early May Survey results announced

from February 19th through February 22nd. An opening presentation and hands-on workshop will kick off the event on Tuesday, February 19th at 6:00pm. Following the presentation, a citizen workshop will allow the community to provide input on existing and future development in Franklin. On Wednesday, February 20th, round table discussions will be held on topics such as neighborhood character, architecture, and housing. Throughout the event, TPUDC's planners will be testing the working draft zoning ordinance through prototypical urban design scenarios. PlanapaloozaTM will conclude with

a work-in-progress presentation on Friday, February 22nd at 3:00pm. All events will take place in City Hall (109 3rd Avenue South) and are open to the public. The training room will be open from Wednesday morning through Friday morning to allow the community an opportunity to provide input if they are unable to make the scheduled events. Our **Human Resources/Risk** department will be conducting two CPR training classes in February for certification and recertification.
