

On June 20, 2018, a **Blue Star Flag** was raised at **Franklin Police Headquarters to honor Officer Steve Chittanavong**, who had been deployed to southwest Asia. At a special ceremony this week, Chief Deborah Faulkner and members of the Franklin Police Department **retired that flag, welcoming the officer home**. More than 30% of the Franklin Police Department is made up of US Military Veterans. The Blue Star Flag honors active-duty military members serving during a period of war or hostilities. Prior to joining the Franklin Police Department in 2014, Chief Faulkner was Tennessee's first Inspector General. A retired Metropolitan Nashville Police Officer, with more than 30 years of service to Nashville, Faulkner came up through the ranks, serving in Metro's Patrol Division and various other assignments before retiring from the MNPD at the rank of Deputy Chief. She has her bachelor's degree in Journalism from the University of Memphis; her master's in Criminal Justice from Middle Tennessee State University; and, her doctorate

in Human Development Counseling from Vanderbilt University.
