Tomorrow, Saturday, March 23rd, at **10am**, thousands of volunteer participants will plant up to 250,000 native tree seedlings in all 95 counties of Tennessee and beyond. The City of Franklin is proud to be a part of **250K Tree Day** again! Last year, we planted 500 seedlings along the Harpeth River, but this year we are aiming to plant 1,000! These seedlings will be planted in a riparian buffer zone and will help to reduce pollution, prevent stream bank erosion, and create a habitat for local wildlife. Please meet at the Harlinsdale Farm Canoe Launch! All volunteers will be required to sign a waiver at the sign-in desk. Volunteers under the age of 18 are required to have a parent/guardian signature. Please dress appropriately for the activities and weather. Gloves and

shovels will be provided, however we encourage all volunteers to bring their own
