Coming next week, April 30th, there will be a public workshop to gather input from community members to share recommendations for the **South Corridor Study**. The **Greater Nashville Regional Council, WeGo Public Transit, and the Tennessee Department of Transportation** is looking to build regional interest to expand public transportation options across Middle Tennessee. The South Corridor experiences some of the heaviest traffic volumes in Tennessee and continues to be one of the fastest growing parts of the nation. The study is being conducted to identify investments that can help manage traffic congestion and improve connectivity between people and businesses. Specifically, the effort will be used to:

- ♣ Identify potential transit/ transportation investments,
- Assess the financial, economic, and technical viability of each, and
- ♣ Identify steps to move the project forward.

The event will happen on Tuesday, April 30th, from 5:30-8:00pm at the Williamson County Library at 1314 Columbia Ave, Franklin TN. The session will be a open house style meeting which allows citizens to "come and go."

It was a big week for the Franklin Fire Department. On Tuesday the department broke ground on Fire

Station 7 which will be located near the Ag Center off the Goose Creek Bypass. The station will be similar in design to Westhaven's Station 8, with the addition of an ambulance wing, which will be funded by Williamson County. The ambulance will be staffed by Williamson Medical Center EMS personnel. Although Station 7 has been planned for several years, the temporary station was established as an emergency measure. It was created to deliver emergency services to southeastern Franklin after a fatal gasoline tanker explosion destroyed the Goose Creek Bypass-Peytonsville Road bridge in 2014.

On Thursday, our City Team celebrated the 29 year career of **Deputy Chief Todd Horton**. The City Hall Boardroom was packed full of co-workers and friends as they said good-bye to Todd. Todd worked his way through the ranks in Franklin from firefighter, engineer, lieutenant, captain, assistant chief, deputy chief, and even acting chief. In his

present role he serves as Deputy Chief of Administration and Emergency

Management. Deputy Chief Horton will leave the City to accept the position of Director of the Williamson County **Emergency Management** Agency. Franklin Fire Chief Rocky Garzarek said, "Very few people dedicate themselves to their job in the manner Deputy Chief Horton has over the past 29 years. We will forever be grateful for his endless hours of hard work, service, and commitment as a tireless professional, loval comrade, and faithful friend. To say we will miss him does not seem to sufficiently express how much he means to us, our











department and our city. We wish him well in his new role and know he will have many more years of great achievements." Thank you, Chief Horton for your dedication and care for the City of Franklin. We look forward to working with you in your new position!
