Beautiful and City Stormwater

Management staff, Dry Branch Wetland has been undergoing a restoration through a series of stream cleanups, non-native invasive removals, and native replantings. Natives that were planted were: switchgrass, swamp milkweed, beebalm, big bluestem, Virginia wild rye, ninebark, persimmon, and sweetgum. **KWB and Stormwater Management** will continue restoration efforts with additional volunteer events in the coming Fall.

Earlier this week, **Parks Director Lisa Clayton** addressed a crowd at the Frank Talks event that was held at High Hopes Development Center and hosted by Franklin Tomorrow. Lisa discussed the plans for an inclusive playground at the new Southeast Park Complex. Lisa shared the goal for the city to partner with the community on the design of the playground, similar to Pinkerton Park's Tinkerbell playground. She said, "when a community gets behind something, then you've got ownership, and it usually lasts!" Jill Moore with Landscape Structures also spoke about the benefits of inclusive playgrounds. Since late 2017, **City Planning and Legal staff** has been working on updating the City Zoning Ordinance, with the goal of guiding the type of high-quality, vibrant, and sustainable development prescribed by Envision Franklin. In February 2019, staff and consultant Town Planning & Urban Design Collaborative (TPUDC) hosted **Planapalooza**, a code demonstration and design process. Staff, stakeholders, and citizens worked with the consultant team to test draft zoning concepts through prototypical urban design scenarios. Staff and TPUDC then continued to work on the zoning ordinance update using input received during Planapalooza. This week the public review draft of the updated zoning ordinance was released for community and stakeholder input. A **Public Draft Open House** will be held on **August 15 from 5-8pm at the City Hall Training Room**. Please find the
