Effective July 1st, the City of Franklin is giving current team members a 2.5% Cost of Living/Market Adjustment and up to an additional 2.5% increase based upon one's evaluation scores (merit). Beginning this past Monday, department directors provided all team members hired prior to January 1, 2019 with a detailed letters describing the pay adjustment. The new pay rates will be paid the first full pay period of July which will be reflected on the July 19th paycheck (today!).
