


Last weekend, members of the **Franklin Fire Department's Honor Guard** served at the **National Fallen Firefighters Foundation Memorial Weekend** in Emmitsburg, MD. In a candlelight ceremony on Saturday evening, they stood watch over the 2018 ceremonial plaques that were unveiled. The plaques are engraved with the names of the 119 firefighters who died in the line of duty in 2018. A special 9/11 plaque bears the names of firefighters who have passed away as a result of responding to the events of 9/11/2001. In

2018 there were 27 names added to the 9/11 plaque. In a ceremony on Sunday morning, FFD's Honor Guard presented flags to the individual families of the fallen, including the families of Fire Chief Richard Chalmers McCormick, of the La Vergne Fire and Rescue

Department, and Engineer Jason Wade Dickey, of the Lawrenceburg Fire Department, who both died in the line of duty in 2018. After the presentation, FFD's Honor Guard, including Assistant Fire Marshal Jonathan Dye, Lieutenant-Paramedic Brian Brandon, Lieutenant Shawn Donovan, and Firefighter-Paramedic Michael Henry, participated in a procession with other Honor Guards and Pipe and Drum Corps from across the country. The Memorial Weekend is a time of sharing and healing for the families. It is a solemn tribute and commemoration of the ultimate sacrifice made by their loved ones.

At Tuesday night's meeting, the **Board of Mayor** and Aldermen approved the updated Human Resources Manual. The manual had not had a full review and update for several years. A copy



of the updated HR Manual is attached for your review. The HR Department will be visiting various departments to review the changes and answer questions. A big thank you to **HR** and Law for their hard work in reviewing and updating the manual.

The Franklin Fire Department was recently honored by Operation Gratitude and Tennessee First Lady Maria Lee with care packages for all of the firefighters. Chief Garzarek accepted the packages, which were presented to him by Mrs. Lee and Operation Gratitude representatives in a reception at the Governor's residence.
