


The City of Franklin is excited to light up the square

As a City team, you all do so much to serve the community. As a part of this year's **United Way campaign**, we want to further recognize and encourage efforts made to support the community through gifts to the United Way and through volunteer efforts. With this in mind, we are launching the "**Give a Day**.



Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign. If you give a contribution of at least \$100 or more to United Way (I'd challenge you to consider giving the equivalent of one day's pay), and commit to volunteer at least 8 hours over the next year with your chosen cause (i.e. – non-profit, church, school, etc.), you can receive an EXTRA personal day in 2020. **The campaign will run through the end of November.** The additional personal day will be awarded on January 1, 2020 and must be used during the 2020 calendar year.

Here's the details:

- Your 2020 pledge to United Way can take the form of a payroll deduction (spread over 26 paychecks in 2020) or as a one-time contribution, which ever works best for you. The minimum pledge to qualify is \$100. You should make your financial pledge using the United Way Pledge Form, which should be available through your department payroll person or through the Human Resources Department.
- We ask that you sign a 2020 volunteer pledge that includes your name, department, and the cause/organization(s) that you are committing to dedicate at least 8 hours of volunteer time (non-work hours) this coming year. (Attached) The choice of

where and how you volunteer is up to you. You may also want to work with other City team members to volunteer as a group. If you are looking for some ideas, United Way has an online volunteer resource: https://uwwc.org/volunteer-resources/. Also, on Saturday, Franklin Tomorrow is hosting an event at Columbia State Community College where you can learn more about some of our local non-profits. That information is attached.

• Once you have made both your United Way pledge and your volunteer pledge you will be credited with an additional personal day on January 1, 2020. The personal day must be used during the 2020 calendar year.

Attached is a form to document your pledge to United Way and to make your volunteer commitment. The attached form will need to be accompanied by your **United Way Pledge Form**. If you have already made your United Way pledge, you will just need to add the attached form to document your volunteer commitment to be eligible for the additional personal day.
