Congratulations to Mayor Ken Moore who was reappointed to the National League of Cities (NLC) Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations

Committee. This committee has the lead responsibility for developing NLC's federal policy positions on issues involving national economic policy, general financial assistance programs, liability insurance, intergovernmental relations, census, municipal bonds and capital finance, municipal management, antitrust issues, citizen participation and civil rights, labor relations, Native American sovereignty and municipal authority. The appointment was announced by NLC President Joe Buscaino, councilmember, Los Angeles, California. As a committee member, Mayor Moore will play a key role in shaping NLC's policy positions and advocate on behalf of America's cities and towns before Congress, with the administration and at home.

Goose Creek Area land use amendment. On October 22, 2019, 26 parcels annexed into the City of Franklin through referendum. The total area that was annexed outside of the Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) totals 474 acres. As we bring this area into the City, we will need to incorporate these properties into the Envision Franklin Land Use Plan. A process has established for amending the land use plan:

- ✓ **Community Meeting** January 15, 2020 5-7 p.m. Eastern Flank (notices will be mailed to property owners and signs posted in the area)
- ✓ **Open Office Hours** January 17, 2020 8 a.m.-5 p.m.
- ✓ **Joint Conceptual Work Shops** January 23rd and February 27th.
- ✓ **Planning Commission** March 26, 2020
