We have lots of road work happening in Franklin over the next several months. The **Franklin Road Corridor Improvements and Streetscape projec**t from the Harpeth Bridge to Industrial Court has begun. It will include sidewalks, underground utilities, lighting and more. week to pave Franklin Road from Country Rd. to Industrial Court; Main Street from the Harpeth Bridge to Five Points; and Columbia Avenue from Five Points to Mack Hatcher. The project is expected to go on through the end of October.

Coronavirus Update: Thursday's COVID-19 case report (8/27/20):

Key Changes:

Up 1,826 more positive cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (149,179 total positive cases – **most total positive cases since the pandemic began**)

Up 150 more active cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (36,090 total active cases)

Up 50 more positive cases day over day in Williamson County (4,260 total positive cases – **most total positive cases since the pandemic began**)


Down 9 fewer active cases day over day in Williamson County (1,159 total active cases)

Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 2.9%

Level Percent Positive / Total Tested at 7.7%

Level Williamson County **sixth** highest # of positive cases in Tennessee

Level No additional deaths in Williamson County (27 – tied for tenth highest in state)
