City of Franklin Free Flu Shot Clinic, October 15th

Flu shots will be provided on Thursday, October 15th from 6am – 9am and 3pm – 5pm at Jim Warren Park. Here is a map showing the pavilion location. Flu shots are offered for all full-time employees and their spouses, part-time employees, retirees and retiree spouses covered by a City of Franklin insurance plan. **This time, we're adding KIDS!** Covered children of full-time employees are welcome to get their free shots, as well! They must be at least 6 months old and accompanied by the parent throughout their time at the park. Please complete the attached registration packet (2 pages) prior to arriving. Forms will be provided on-site if you are unable to complete them beforehand. We will follow recommended CDC guidelines as well as additional COF protocols.

Three **Franklin Firefighters** have been **deployed to Louisiana ahead of Hurricane Delta** to aid in expected search and rescue efforts. Hurricane Delta is a Category 2 storm forecasted to make landfall today. **Lt. Jonathan Gill** and **Firefighters Rob Thomas and Todd Wilson** are part of the TN Task Force 2 (TNTF2) deployment. TNTF2 is comprised of several Middle Tennessee agencies. The deployment is initially expected to last 14 days, however it can be reduced or extended depending on the needs of Louisiana officials.

Don't forget about our "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign for United Way. If you give a total contribution of at least \$100 to United Way (I'd challenge you to consider giving the equivalent of one day's pay), and commit to volunteer at least 8 hours over the next year with your chosen cause (i.e. – non-profit, church, school, etc.), you can receive an EXTRA personal day in 2021. The additional personal day will be awarded on January 1, 2021 and must be used during the 2021 calendar year.

Here are the details:

- ➤ Your 2021 pledge to United Way can take the form of a payroll deduction (spread over 26 paychecks in 2021) or as a one-time contribution, which ever works best for you. The minimum pledge to qualify is \$100. You should make your financial pledge using the attached United Way Pledge Form or request a form from Administration or Human Resources.
- ➤ We ask that you sign a 2021 volunteer pledge that includes your name, department, and the cause/organization(s) that you are committing to dedicate at least 8 hours of volunteer time (non-work hours) this coming year (attached). The choice of where and how you volunteer is up to you. You may also want to work with other City team members to volunteer as a group. - ➤ Once you have made both your United Way pledge and your volunteer pledge you will be credited with an additional personal day on January 1, 2021. The personal day must be used during the 2021 calendar year.

The "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign runs through November 2nd. Both forms will need to be returned to Human Resources. If you are submitting via e-mail,

Over the past week, we have experienced a significant increase in active cases in the community. The number of cases or cases related to family members are actually down and at a very low level. Keep up the good work! Here are the most recent COVID numbers:


Key Changes:


Up 1,992 more positive cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (209,447 total positive cases – **most total positive cases since the pandemic began**)



Up 515 more active cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (16,752 total active cases)
Up 35 more positive cases day over day in Williamson County (5,833 total positive cases – most total positive cases since the pandemic began)
Down 17 fewer active cases day over day in Williamson County (525 total active cases)
Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 2.8%
Level Percent Positive / Total Tested at 7.4%

Level Williamson County sixth highest # of positive cases in Tennessee
 Up One (1) additional deaths in Williamson County (42 - twelfth highest in state)





*State of Tennessee changed definition of inactive/recovered cases from those individuals who were at least 21-days after first positive test to at least 14 days on September 3rd.
