

# Tree and Plant List

## Prohibited Trees and Plants

Plants listed on the current edition of the Invasive Exotic Pest Plants of Tennessee, as published by the Tennessee Exotic Pest Plant Council, shall be prohibited and shall not be credited towards the minimum requirements of this Ordinance. Further, the City recommends removal of invasive plant materials when found in areas of a site containing existing vegetation.

Beyond this published list, the City prohibits the following trees:

<i>Acer saccharinum</i>	Silver Maple
Prohibited as screening shrubs

<i>Euonymus kiautschovicus</i>	Manhattan euonymous
<i>Abelia species</i>	Glossy Abelia
Prohibited as street trees	
Scientific Name	Common Name
<i>Acer saccharum</i>	Sugar Maple
<i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>	Tuliptree
<i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>	Blackgum
<i>Quercus pagoda</i>	Cherrybark Oak
<i>Quercus palustris</i>	Pin Oak (prohibited as street tree and parking lot tree)
<i>Taxodium distichum</i>	Bald Cypress

## Preferred Street Trees

The City prefers columnar trees for Street Trees, and that they be planted a maximum of 20' on center. \* - May be used if there are overhead utility lines.

The following is a list of City-preferred street trees:

Preferred Street Trees	
Scientific Name	Common Name
<i>Acer rubrum</i>	Red Maple
<i>Ginkgo biloba</i>	Ginkgo Tree (male only)
<i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i>	Sweetgum (seedless)
<i>Quercus falcata</i>	Southern Red Oak
<i>Quercus nattalli</i>	Nuttall Oak
<i>Quercus phellos</i>	Willow Oak
<i>Ulmus parvifolia</i>	Chinese/Lacebark Elm (disease-resistant variety)
<i>Zelkova serrata</i>	Japanese Zelkova
<i>Prunus x yedoensis</i>	Yoshino Cherry *
