



Up 3,344 More positive cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (296,725 total positive cases)

Up 228 More active cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (30,410 total active cases)

Up 115 More positive cases day over day in Williamson County (8,892 total positive cases)

Down 8 Less active cases day over day in Williamson County (1,163 total active cases)

Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at **3.0%**

Down Percent Positive / Total Tested at 9.1%

Level Williamson County **Seventh** highest # of positive cases in Tennessee

Level No new deaths in Williamson County
