Sad news to report this morning: former **Mayor Tom Miller** passed away yesterday afternoon. Tom served as Mayor from 2003-07 and also served for six years as an At-Large Alderman. Tom was also chairman of the Franklin Planning Commission for five years. During his service with the City, Mayor Miller was instrumental in important initiatives such as the building the new Franklin Police Headquarters, the recruitment of the Nissan Headquarters, and the acquisition/addition of Harlinsdale Farm and Eastern Flank to the City's park system. Mayor Miller also played a key leadership role in establishing the City of Franklin's relationship with troops at Fort Campbell. We are grateful for Tom's service to the community and for his many contributions to Franklin. While I never served with Tom, I know from my interactions with him over the years that he cared deeply for our City team. Tom Miller will be missed. Please keep Lydia, the Miller family, and Tom's many friends in your thoughts and prayers during this difficult time of loss.

Bransford was a resident of Franklin for more than 35 years, spending almost 25 years as an elected official in Franklin, first for 11 years on the Franklin Special School District Board of Education and then 13 years as a member of the Franklin Board of



Mayor and Aldermen. Her public service was an amplification of her outstanding professional career in nursing. She received a BS in Nursing from Tennessee State University, BS in Health Arts from University of St. Francis, Joliet, Ill., and an MS in Nursing from Vanderbilt University. She served in a variety of leadership and teaching roles during her 18 years at Vanderbilt University Medical Center and was highly respected by the professionals and students with whom she worked. Up 6 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (1,005 total active cases)


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at **3.1%**
