Mayor Schroer recognized public works department directors, especially in light of the flood as well as all the men and women from those departments working on the streets during and after the flood. He added that he had not heard anything negative during his visits to 100 homes or at a meeting held last night. He said he was pleased to be Mayor of a City that responds as Franklin has. He noted all city responders are well trained in their jobs. There were no lives lost nor were there any injuries: Not even when firefighters were in waist deep water fighting a fire. Mayor Schroer thanked the cities of Knoxville and Sevierville for the aid and use of equipment.

Alderman Burger related the head of the FEMA team said the City was well prepared and that City officials should be proud of the community and the people who work for the community.

Eric Stuckey praised the employee team and the many folks who responded to community needs. He stated that he is proud of them.
