COVID UPDATE: Starting Monday, April 19th, there will be no more specific entry points at City Hall that employees must use nor will there be a temperature check requirement by the Fire entrance. Every City employee is still expected to answer the six (6) screening questions prior to starting your work shift (these are the questions you see each day when logging onto a City computer):

- 1) Have you been close (within 6 feet) contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19?
- 2) Are you experiencing cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat?
- 3) Have you had a fever (100 degrees or above) in the last 48 hours?
- 4) Have you had a new loss of taste or smell?
- 5) Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?
- 6) Within the past two weeks, have you traveled, been deployed or participated in activities that subject you to potential exposure to COVID-19?

The change in the temperature check process applies to City Hall team members. Please check with your supervisor if you report to work outside of City Hall regarding any changes in this process. If you have any questions, please reach out to your supervisor or your Human Resources COVID Representative.

In partnership with **Williamson Medical Center**, the City of Franklin would like to improve the health and safety of **our City team (and their immediate family members) by hosting COVID-19 vaccination clinics on April 22**nd! The clinic will be held in the Williamson Medical Center Tower, Suite 600. These vaccines will be Moderna vaccines and your second dose will be scheduled for May 20th. Up 13 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (489 total active cases


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at **3.3%**


Down Percent Positive / Total Tested at **12.12%**
