Up 1,092 More positive cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (846,472 total positive cases)

Down 173 Fewer active cases day over day in the State of Tennessee (12,595 total active cases)

Up 26 More positive cases day over day in Williamson County (27,833 total positive cases)

Down 23 Fewer active cases day over day in Williamson County (391 total active cases) *the first time the County falls under 400 active cases since 10/03/2020*

Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 3.3%


Down Percent Positive / Total Tested at **12.01%**
