Up 17 More positive cases day over day in Williamson County (28,834 total positive cases)


Up 10 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (157 total active cases)


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 3.3%


Down Percent Positive / Total Tested at 11.39%
