The state has recently credentialed its first inter-agency Special Operations Team of any kind – a City of Franklin, City of Brentwood, and Williamson County Swift Water

Team. Emergency responders from all of these jurisdictions who are Swift Water Rescue Technicians, including those from both fire and police/sheriff's departments, gathered in Franklin at the end of July to complete the credentialing process. Up 75 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (1,063 total active cases)


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 3.3%


Up Percent Positive / Total Tested at **11.49%**
