This past **Saturday**, **June 19**th Franklin celebrated **Juneteenth downtown and at Pinkerton Park**. Downtown, the justice and equity coalition held a festival with music and information booths and food trucks; the event at Pinkerton Park featured the unveiling of a new marker commemorating General Granger and Emancipation. In June 1865, two years after Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation freeing slaves, General Gordon Granger (stationed then in Galveston TX) signed an order notifying everyone in the state that all slaves are free. In many cases, the enslaved had never been told the news about the Emancipation. The celebration known as Juneteenth was thus born and African Americans have celebrated this special event since 1866. **See the video from both events here** https://www.facebook.com/CitvOfFranklin/videos/194767792551333

STATION 7 GRAND OPENING CELEBRATION/OPEN HOUSE JUNE 29TH!

Help celebrate the opening of new **Franklin Fire Station 7 on Tuesday, June 29th, from 3-5 PM**! The station is located beside the Williamson County Ag Expo Center at 1972 John Fitzgerald Dr.

The event will include a "hose-uncoupling" ceremony for the new station and a traditional "wetdown" ceremony for the apparatus. Children and adults may help wash the trucks and place them into service. Station tours, snow cones, plastic fire hats for children, and much more will be available. Station 7 is the first Franklin fire station to include an ambulance wing, which was funded by Williamson County and staffed by Williamson Medical Center EMS personnel.

Level No New active cases day over day in Williamson County (46 total active cases)


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 3.3%
