Do you like food? Do you like food trucks? Do you like <u>free</u> delicious food served from food trucks? Have we got a deal for you!



I've added a graph posted by Williamson Medical Center on their social media yesterday. According to WMC:

"With the recent dramatic surge in COVID positive cases in Williamson County and Middle Tennessee, Williamson Medical Center has experienced increased demand on our COVID inpatient floors and on our intensive care units.

Even though we are seeing a younger COVID positive population requiring inpatient care, especially in the unvaccinated population, a much greater percentage of current COVID inpatients are requiring advanced and mechanical methods to assist in breathing, putting pressure on the availability of equipment, staff and critical care beds to provide this care.

Williamson Medical Center strongly encourages the community to do their part to protect themselves, their loved ones and their neighbors by getting vaccinated, maintaining social distance and wearing a face mask in public."



Up 151 More positive cases day over day in Williamson County (31,945 total positive cases)


Up 46 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (1,558 total active cases)
