From the **Human Resources Department**:

FSA Open Enrollment is OPEN NOW through November 30! <u>FSA and dependent care are not automatic enrollments</u>. Your 2021 account will terminate if you do not reenroll.

A flexible spending account (FSA), is a benefit offered to all full time employees. This benefit allows you to use pre-tax dollars to pay for eligible health care expenses for you, your spouse, and your dependents.

During open enrollment, you decide on an estimated amount of money that you plan to use in **2022** on eligible medical expenses. Your contribution for your FSA account will be deducted in equal amounts from each paycheck, pre-tax, throughout the plan year. (24 pay periods) You will receive a Visa card, loaded with the full amount you elected during open enrollment. You can then use your pre-tax dollars to pay for eligible healthcare expenses throughout the year.

The maximum amount you can elect is \$2,750 per year with up to \$550 in carryover funds. Anything carried over into the next plan year must be used by March 31, 2023, or the previous year's funds will be lost.

Up 53 More positive cases day over day in Williamson County (40,067 total positive cases)


Up 24 More active cases day over day in Williamson County (351 total active cases)


Level Williamson County share of total positive cases within Tennessee at 3.1%
