The Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) plans to do **their annual memorial ceremony for fallen officers on Monday, May 9th in downtown Franklin.** The invitation from the FOP is attached. The ceremony will begin in the Historic Franklin Presbyterian Church at Five Points at 6 p.m. At the conclusion of the program, the procession will exit the theater and travel down Main St to the Public Square. The procession will travel under a large American flag that will be displayed from two Franklin Fire trucks parked at the entrance of Main St onto the Square. Various marked patrol units from each participating agency will be on the Square. The procession will conclude at the Historic Courthouse where closing

remarks will be made. During the procession, Main Street will be closed from Five Points to 2nd Ave. Once the Procession crosses 4th Avenue, Main Street from Five Points will be re-opened. The Square will remain closed until the end of the ceremony at the Courthouse.

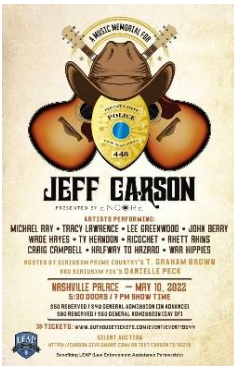
Employee of the Quarter:
